Orienteering is a sport which involves using specially drawn maps and sometimes a compass to navigate around a pre-set course. It can be either a competitive sport or simply a relaxed walk where you enjoy the countryside.

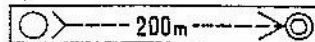

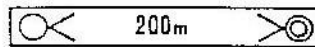
