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# Geoff Morrison receives NZSSSC Service to School Sport Award

NZSSSC regularly confers Service to School Sport Awards, "presented to people who, as volunteers, have made contributions to secondary school sport that are deemed to be exceptional." A nominee would be expected to have contributed to secondary school sport beyond simply a local level, at perhaps regional, island or national level over a long period.

Geoff Morrison has recently stepped down as NZ Orienteering Federation Secondary Schools Coordinator after 11 years of service as a volunteer. Geoff can take a large part of the credit

for the growth in orienteering activity at secondary school level, attending most secondary school championships over the last decade and instituting systems to make it easier for organising clubs to host these events.

One of the highlights over the last decade has been the introduction of a New Zealand Secondary Schools team that competes annually at the Australian Schools Championships, which Geoff helped to implement.

Geoff had a strong belief that the key to the sport's development was through schools. Having successfully managed that in Hawke's Bay, he turned his attention to "spreading the word" into other areas by taking on the role of National Secondary Schools Coordinator. His work over a number of years now sees other areas flourishing with secondary school events and participation.

Geoff continues to coach school children in the Hawke's Bay and on behalf of NZ Secondary Schools and all the students that have benefitted from Geoff's dedication. NZSSSC thank him and congratulate him on his award.

Yellow and White saw lots of new competitors, in preparation for the Primary School Champs. Bayley Stephens-Ellison and Hannah Matthews came out on top in the yellow, and Monique Way and Luke Smiley in white.

Steve Armon was a great help as my vetter and put me straight on a few technical aspects and I thank you very much Steve, as would the people doing the white course as I initially had them doing about as much climb as getting to Mt Everest's base camp by about the second control. Steve said we should try and make this event as challenging as possible even though it was just a club event but that it wasn't a matter of life and death but I think it could have been for some of the little ones doing the white course if Steve hadn't vetted it first. We did everything I think possible to make sure that the controls were all in their correct locations. It was quite a lot of fun and very educational taking the time to study different control sites, planning route choices, attack points, features, contour lines, handrails, the use of doglegs and the degree of difficulty with navigation none of which I take any notice of when I'm doing an event.

# "HAVVERGATE"

(a fundraising event for the Havelock North High School Orienteering team)

**Sunday, 17 July, 2011**

**Organise your team - workmates, schoolmates, family & friends – and take on the challenge of navigating in and around Havelock North.**

You will receive a colour map with 27 mystery locations marked - each location has a different points value. The aim is to 'havvergate' as many locations as possible and to score the maximum points possible within the 3 hour time limit.

### Event Information:

- The event centre will be at Havelock North High School, Te Mata Road, Havelock North.
- Registration will open at 9.00am.
- Be ready to start at 10.00am. There will be a race briefing then maps will be handed out at 10.15am (15 minutes planning time allowed).
- The race will start at 10.30am and finish by 1.30pm. Penalties apply for late finishing - 10 points for every part minute, all points lost after 30 minutes.
- There will be no compulsory gear. We recommend that you dress for the conditions and carry sufficient water to keep hydrated while exercising. Feel free to stop at a local café for refreshments!
- The event will use the Sport-ident electronic timing system - every competitor will carry a timing chip.

### Rules:

- Teams must comprise 2 - 5 competitors.
- Teams must only travel by foot.
- Team members must stay together at all times.
- Every team member must register at the electronic control to earn the points value.

### Safety:

Competitors will encounter public roads, cliffs, steep and slippery underfoot conditions. Competitors participate at their own risk and the organisers bear no responsibility for any injury while competing.

### Entry Fee:

# World Schools' Championships—Primerio, Italy

Callum Herries and Brianna Massie were each second in the boys' and girls' Junior Long race while Isaac Sweetapple teamed up with a Slovenian and a Belgian to win the Friendship Relay. # Memory Lane:

## Setter's Reports: 2010 Score Champs 2011 OY 1 Springvale

Sorry Hugh, I know I'm late handing in my homework. Would you believe the dog ate it? I was abducted by aliens? My dog was abducted by aliens?

I had the good fortune to be vetted by Hamish Goodwin when I set the 2010 Score Champs, on September 5<sup>th</sup> at Te Awanga. This event had originally been planned for Taheke, which would have been a much easier for Hamish. When Taheke became unavailable at short notice, the Te Awanga landowner and leaseholder stepped up, despite it being the middle of calving. I got bovine placenta on my shoes!

*Observation 1: The generosity of our landowners is phenomenal.*

As usual, the requirements of the White Course limited our choice of start areas. We picked the western part of the pine forest because we had used the eastern part for a Club Event earlier in the year. Hamish pointed out the steep east-facing slope along the edge of the forest. "Stay out of there, it's crap", he warned. I shot out to have a look around on my next day off and spent two hours tearing skin off my legs to prove Hamish right. My second mistake that day was to drive my Prado down a gently sloping grass covered track in the forest to save a bit of walking. While I was out in the blackberry, it rained and I nearly had to walk home. Took about ten attempts, very low tyre pressure and an impressive muddy mess to get out. Silly boy! I rang the Forest Manager to confess. He was very relaxed about it, but appreciated the call.

*Observation 2: If you mess something up or find a problem on a map ring the Landowner immediately. The Landowners appreciate it and it is good for the Club's reputation, though not necessarily yours.*

As always, I picked up some pearls of wisdom from my Vetter. A Score Event isn't simply a matter of throwing 27 controls at a map and firing it off to Dave Fisher for printing. Hamish was very patient and polite about my early attempts. He gave advice about route choice and control placement. He is also an expert on the treatment of blackberry scratches – apparently a can of Harden Up works wonders. A lot of planning can be done in the comfort of your home, using Condes and an Internet connection to your Vetter, but don't leave your first map visit too late. 2010 was a great year for blackberry at Te Awanga. Several areas that I had planned to put controls in had become



impassable. Hamish showed me how to measure possible ideal routes around all 27 controls and, taking the terrain into account, achieve a course that would challenge the best runners to finish in one hour. Several big gullies full of blackberry provided route choice for us.

*Observation 3: Don't spend too much time planning before you visit the map to see what's changed. Those of you who ran at Craggy Range on June 12<sup>th</sup> have seen what a big rain can do to a map.*

The 2010 Score Champs were memorable, because on Saturday September 4<sup>th</sup> I listened to the news reports about the first Christchurch earthquake while driving out to place the controls. Fortunately, I also remember a great day on Sunday, no cock-ups by the Setter and satisfied runners. Congratulations to Rolf Boswell who collected 42 points in 57:55, indicating that my course wasn't too easy! Possibly too difficult? I got another crack at a Score Event this year with Murray Richardson. I think we'll call it Murray Squared. Thanks to Hamish for vetting me at Te Awanga and everyone who helped me on the day.

I put my hand up to set OY 1 this year at Springvale because I love the area. I think there is something special about the Smedley/Evertree/Springvale map. Often referred to as Totara Country, the area is rich historically, having been logged for native timber to build early New Zealand and then broken in for farming. The Evertree landowner told me last year that, prior to logging, you could walk from Evertree to Tikokino without seeing the sun. Luckily, due to the nature of the land and limitations of early logging methods, many of the gullies were left untouched. This has left us some good orienteering challenges among some magnificent native trees that are hundreds of years old. The steep and often impenetrable gullies provide route choice, too.

*Observation 4: We are privileged to have access to some special places through Orienteering (see also Observation 1)*

Chris Howell was my Vetter for OY 1, despite his grape harvest looming and having a course to set for Nationals. Chris knows Springvale well, so I was able to get feedback and advice on course shapes and lengths while playing around on Condes at home. However, observation 3 was reinforced: on our first walk around, we found a large cultivated area smack in the middle of my courses, a new road (built without HBOC's permission!) and several new fences. The landowner seemed unconcerned about us running over his newly sown grass, but we decided it best not to abuse his generosity and marked the area out of bounds. Some of the new fencing was keeping stock out of an unlogged gully on the SW of the map. Once stock are excluded and pest control done, these areas thicken up very

quickly. Some of you will remember the area of thick bush on Evertree last year. This was fenced off in 1961 and is now a navigational challenge, with the bush obscuring many contour features. I was keen to use the long steep bush-filled gully in the North part of the map to give a route choice for the Red runners. I'm sure it was Chris's idea to see if it was crossable. It





is... if you have an hour to spare and don't mind crawling up cliffs, under the bush and through blackberry on your hands and knees! Despite this, I enjoyed my time at Springvale. We were there during The Roar, so there were plenty of randy deer noises ..... or was that Chris crossing another electric fence? I enjoyed watching two 4x4 fertiliser trucks working the steep hills on the North part of the map – I'm sure my Prado could do that.

I struggled most with Red Short at Springvale. There were plenty of navigational challenges, but they seemed quite spread out. Getting a challenging course through interesting areas, but not too long and steep, taxed my middle-aged brain. Putting the Start where we did helped, but those of you who whinged about it, remember it was Chris' idea. I think the event went off well. Rain was forecast, but it held off until control collection time. We were caught out with too few RL and RM maps. Thanks to those runners who waited patiently for recycled maps or went (all the way!) back to the caravan to get them.

*Observation 5: UHF radios for Start and caravan to communicate wouldn't be silly when the Start is remote. I have a pair that the Club are welcome to borrow.*

Some clubs have printers at their events to avoid this problem. The HBOC Committee has discussed this. Colour laser printers are getting cheap enough, we have generator power, but we are mindful that the caravan is getting cluttered and already weighs over 1000kg. However, a printer in the caravan is probably in the Club's future somewhere.

Running back to the caravan didn't stop Hamish Goodwin blitzing the RL in 1:15:30.

Four RL runners miss punched. I wonder if the course was too long and confusing? Jon Eames took out RM in 59:03. Sean Morrison showed RS the way in 36:49 and Ken Holst was the first RS Vet at 56:41. Orange was won in 54:03 by Jarod Lobb and Yellow in 38:23 by Hamish Duncan. Jasmine Ngan-Sue prevented a clean sweep by the blokes, winning White in 26:58.

Inspired by the fertiliser trucks, and not wanting to get wet collecting controls, indulged in some more four wheel driving. A freshly bulldozed and unmetalled track down a steep bank, through a marsh and back up round two hairpin corners proved irresistible. Man it was soft! Sunk up to m axles, had all the whizzy bits working hard on the Prado, but got through without stopping. I rang the landowner (see Observation 2)

and confessed. "No worries, mate. The tractor would have messed it up anyway. You guys can come back anytime you like", he said. (see Observation 1 and 2).

Thanks to Chris for vetting me and all the people who helped me on the day.
