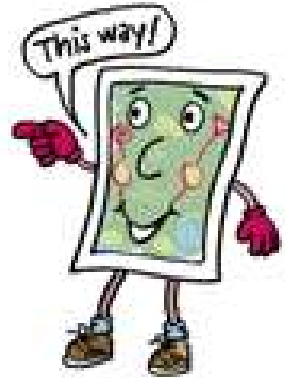

**Ross:** How horribly unfit I was. ( Still am!)

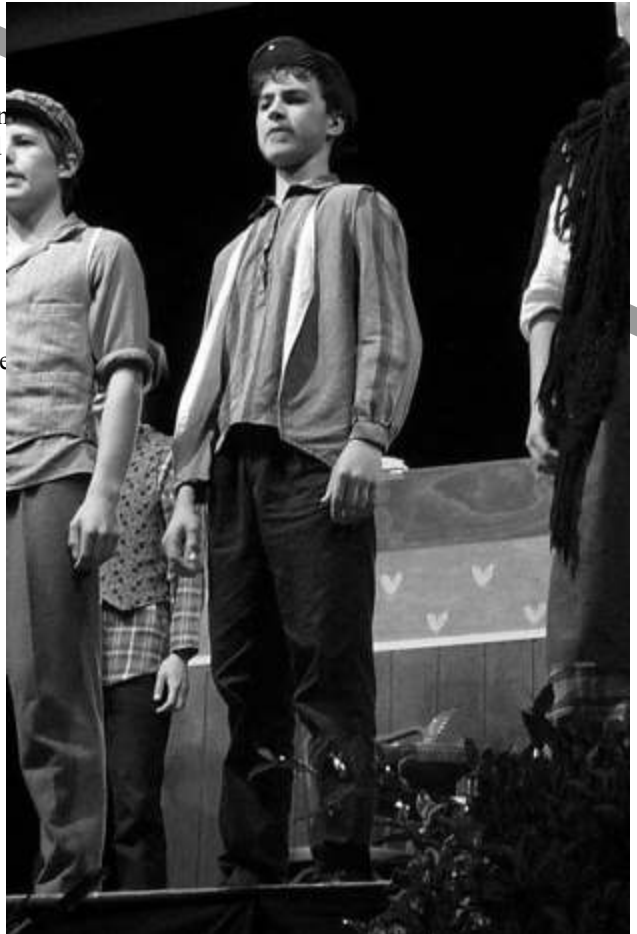
**Sue:** Having to draw your own course on the map
