Summer Series 3

Tamatea

It was with trepidation that I saw I was setting my first ever course, having the pressure of upholding the great Beckman courses and having my biggest critic living under the same roof as me. Luckily Devon was not my Vetter for us to clash heads with. Best laid plans of getting to the map in the January School holidays did not eventuate, I was fairly confident of knowing the map as I had helped Jane and her crew do three days at Tamatea Intermediate in December 2014 with Kiwi O.

Big Bro Devon did give me a lesson in how to use condes, and we dabbled around in the art of course making, with some tips of what makes a good urban sprint course, also Tama tea is a fairly small map so some careful thought was needed to make it interesting and long enough. The main advice I gathered from my in-house so called “expert” was Sprint orienteer is fast, the flow is important, having route choice and easy to understand format.

I started planning my first course, and had already decided to have two butterflies, due to the small map area I had to contend with, both schools have some good route choices and I chose to have some gates closed and some areas marked impassable where the controls are up on deck forcing competitors to read their maps carefully and not cross the impassable line. (I do understand there was a few competitors who chose to ignore the impassable line and put their hand through the balustrade of the deck or climb over!) Courses planned I was feeling pretty happy with myself until I realised the courses were a little short. Discussion with my Vetter Ieaun we decided to put a loop out to Anderson Park to increase the length, which also in turn added some route choice. This loop proved to unstuck a couple of people as they charged back from the Park directly to the Pivot, not reading their map and not going to a control in the school before the Pivot. Not naming any names, although I see Hugh might have done this which contributed to his mispunch?

A week before the event, I met Ieaun on site to go over the courses, double check the map and ensure no buildings had gone up over the Christmas/New Year break. All was good until I myself climb over a closed gate in the Intermediate School and couldn't get down from the top of the gate. Ieaun and my driver Devon all they could do was laugh and laugh at me in my predicament of being perched on the top of the gate. Eventually they did get bored of this entertainment and helped me down.

The day of the event, I had my driver Devon take me early to the map as I was unsure how long all this setting up was going to take. Our usual support crew of Mum and Dad was unavailable as Dad had thrown himself 5 metres off a roof (well actually fallen) the day before and had been helicoptered into Hastings Hospital where he was still recovering. Luckily on the day with great help from Jane & Phillip, Catherine, Ieaun and Roger Mulvay coming in earlier to help set up it all went smoothly. Thanks also to Pamela on the computer and registration and Dave Fisher for organising the printing of the maps.

The evening was busy and we had 263 competitors, the feedback I heard on the evening was good, so I hope you enjoyed the course. My biggest critic Devon raced around in 14:03 minutes, for the 2.6km course. We had a slight glitch with our first pivot not registering but this was soon sorted and like a well oiled machine another successful event was held by HBOC. Thanks to all involved.

This was achieved using two pivot points, one in Cornwall Park and one in Taikura School to create a big butterfly loop in the school.

I went back to run the draft map for the white and loop courses and decide on which gates to open and which to close and tweaked a few of the control positions. We also had to get a council key organised in case the Chinese gardens were closed as scheduled at 7pm, which would have frustrated many of the runners who still had that loop to complete. I enjoyed the variation of the map ranging from the technical buildings (including upstairs), forest area and playground (in Taikura) to the Chinese gardens and pergolas and the rest of the park (in Cornwall). For the white, the course went past the screeching birds in the aviary and it was hard to hear the beep of the SI chip so the flash of light check was essential.

It was a great turnout with around 200 people who ran the loop or white courses. There were lots of positive comments at the end. This is the first course I've set, and with a lot of support from Steve as the map vetter and from the club I think I learnt a lot, and hopefully I will be asked again.

As usual when designing courses, the white course proved the most challenging to set. I was keen to follow on from last year's event and have lots of changes in direction even if I didn't have the same level of high density fencing. Thanks to my son Callum for going over my courses to simplify some of the loops I used to add distance.

Most of the controls went out on Saturday. That left a few controls and lots and lots of tape to put out early on Sunday morning which I seemed to fit in just before my early starters arrived at 9.30.

Landowners and stock manager were great and just said go for it. They are used to having their land used for activities. This was the case with the cattle too. I had also allowed some room at the southern end of the paddocks for them to settle to once they got bored with our activities and this seemed to work well. It was very nice to not to have to worry getting electric fences switched off.

Thanks to all those that heeded my plea for help with coaching. It was great to have your support. I hope everyone enjoyed themselves out on the courses and are looking forward to their year of O.
