Terrain & map notes	Rolling farmland with many areas of scattered and intricate rock features
Out of bounds:	As indicated by tapes and signs

Directions:	From Havelock North travelling east take Te Mata Road to its end and turn right on to Waimarama Road. After crossing the Tukituki River, bear right and immediately left travelling up hill to stay on Waimarama Road, Approx. 5km from Tukituki bridge, turn right from Waimarama Road into Maraetotara Road and travel approx. 20km to the event centre. Signs will be posted from intersection of The Mata Rd and Waimarama Road. It will take approx. 45 minutes from Havelock North
Parking:	In paddock off the road
Whistles:	Competitors are encouraged to carry a whistle. The distress signal is 6 short blasts, rest, then repeat. Use in the case of injury or emergency only.
Start:	There is a 10-minute walk from the car park to the start – please note there are NO toilets at the start
Finish:	At the event centre
Casual starts:	Casual starts will be at the controller's discretion a suitable time after the last start on each course. Usual map fees will apply. Approximate times from 1.00pm.
Course closure:	3.00pm

There is some onga onga on the red and orange courses that can be easily avoided. Some of the tracks are grassed over; this can make them less distinct.

There is a water station at the spectator control three quarters of the way through the red and orange courses. The spectator control can be clearly seen from the track to the start and is visible from the event centre. Spectators are welcome to walk up the track for a closer place to watch, but please do NOT leave the track.

Saturday - Relay Championships

Map:	Maraetotara West
Scale:	1:10,000 for orange courses, 5m contours. 1:7,500 for white and yellow courses, 5m contours.
Terrain:	Rolling farmland with many areas of scattered and intricate rock features
Important:	There are many large cliffs on this map. Please take care if you are approaching them from the uphill side

Directions:	From Havelock North travelling east take Te Mata Road to its end and turn right on to Waimarama Road. After crossing the Tukituki River, bear right and immediately left travelling up hill to stay on Waimarama Road, Approx. 5km from Tukituki bridge, turn right from Waimarama Road into Maraetotara Road and travel approx. 11.5km to the event centre. Signs will be posted from intersection of Te Mata Rd and Waimarama Road. It will take approx. 35 minutes from Havelock North
Parking:	In paddock off the road
Start:	At the event centre
Finish:	At the event centre
Out of bounds:	As indicated by tapes and signs
Whistles:	Competitors are encouraged to carry a whistle. The distress signal is 6 short blasts, rest, then repeat. Use in the case of injury or emergency only.
Safety Bearing:	East to Maraetotara Road then either north or south along the road to the event centre
Briefing:	At 9.45 am there will be a briefing for all starters to explain the relay changeover procedures.
Massed starts:	There will be a mass start for anyone who hasn't started at 11.45 am.
Course closure:	2:00 pm.

Casual starts: Casual starts will be at the controller's discretion a suitable time after the last start on each course. Usual map fees will apply. Approximate times from 1.00pm.

Teams: "Official teams" are made up of students, of the same gender and from the same school, who are eligible to compete in the class.
To cater for students who are not able to be placed in a school team, composite teams will be made up. These teams will run unofficially (i.e. their team placing will not be recognised in the school team competition).

Prize giving A prize giving will be held at the completion of the relay on Saturday. Medals will be awarded to winners of the individual secondary school championship grades and ribbons will be awarded to all placegetters. There are also trophies for the winning boys' and girls' schools.
