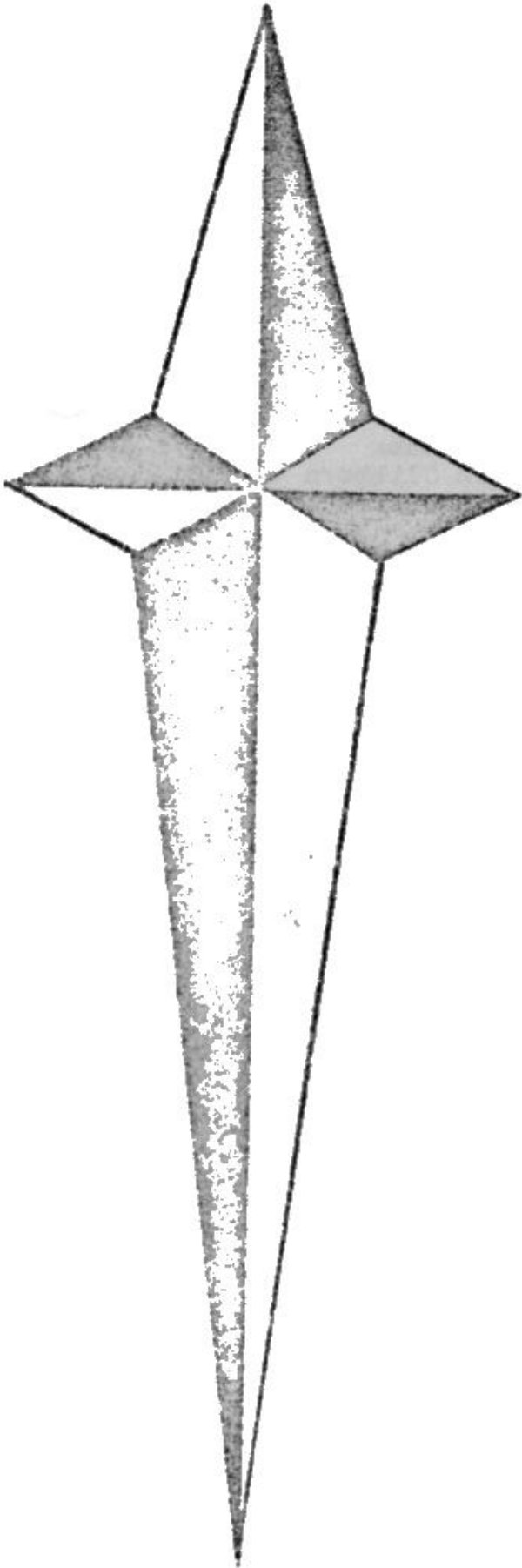

Our social convener - Grant Smith is organising two film evenings in the near future.

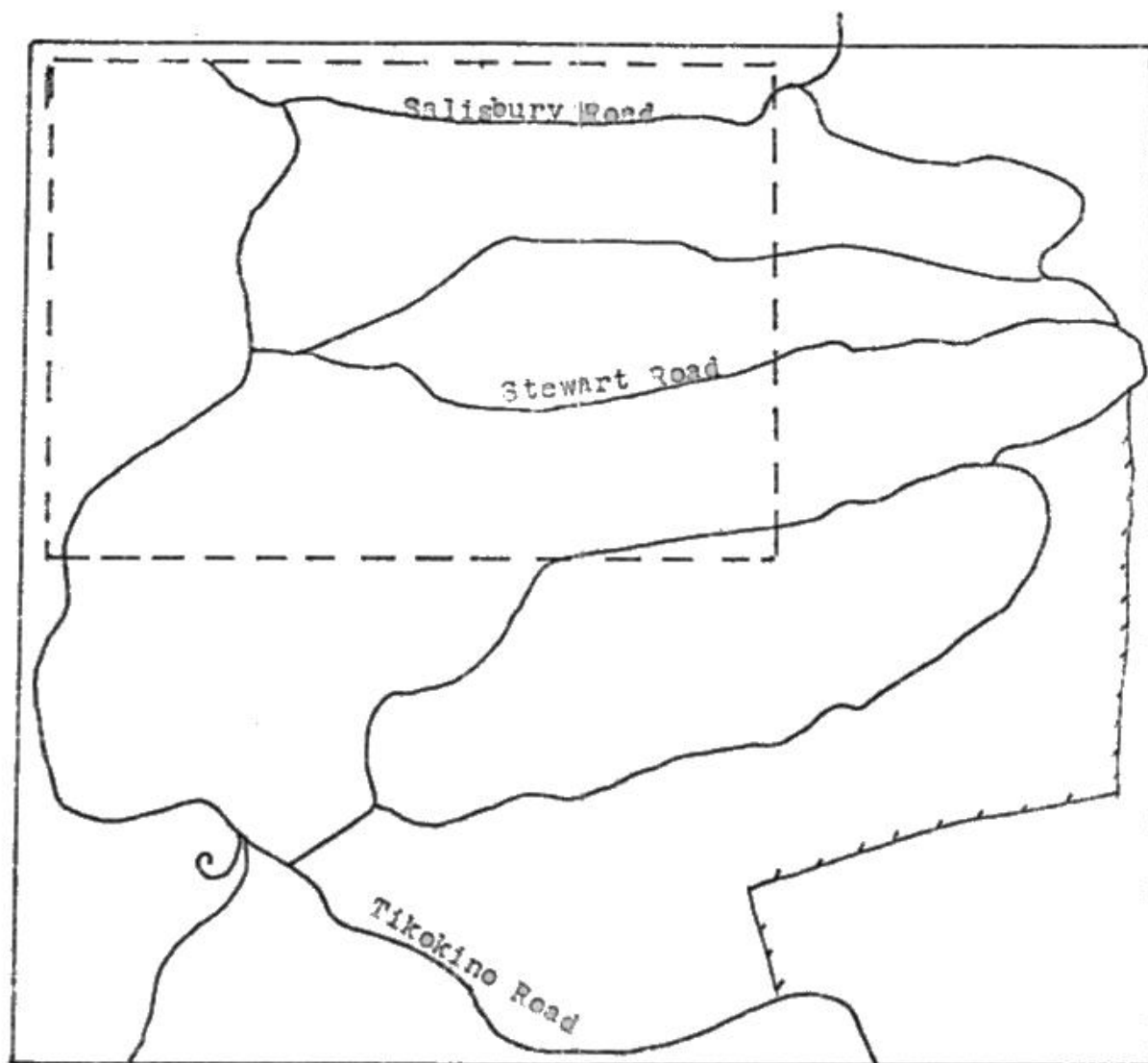
