F U N    R U N

The Annual "Round the Napier Hill" Fun Run is on on the 4th October commencing at 2 p.m. This is also the date of our Te Mata Park Family Meet. We intend to use this event (the Fun Run) as a promotional opportunity by setting up the Club caravan near the Start/Finish, and soliciting entries for the Relays the following week.

If you are in to Fun Runs, please come along after the Te Mata event wearing your Club T-Shirt.

They came to a place called Golgotha, which means "The Place of the Skull" .. .. Matthew 27 v 33.

When asked if I would join a carload going to Ngaumu Forest for the September 6 Badge event, I blithely accepted. In fact, within a few days, I was quite looking forward to the experience of having a crack at Ngaumu.

However, it was not long before my mood of cheerful anticipation was rudely shattered. One evening, Dave Holt phoned to fill me in with the relevant details:

The start time - That was OK  
The course length - That was OK  
The total climb involved - That was OK  
The NAME of the Map - That did it.

That particular telephone conversation was terminated leaving me in a condition of mild shock.

GOLGOTHA !! Why on earth would anybody want to call an area that, of all names ! A couple of theories presented themselves to me and neither did much for my morale.

Was it named in memory of orienteers who had entered the forest and have not been seen since ? Imagine a forest haunted by the spectres of frustrated orienteers: silently running in everlasting circles clutching needleless compasses in boney hands with pealless whistles clamped between skeletal jaws - ugh !

Or was it simply named in expectation of the martyrs the area was likely to produce on the 6th September. That thought did not appeal either. I had no intentions of becoming a statistical memorial to any sadistic mapper. My orienteering philosophy is based soundly on the concept of being a present coward as opposed to being a missing martyr and I had no wish to revise this system.

Saturday - 5th September - Worst weather forecast I have ever seen for the southern end of the North Island. Just what I expected.

Sunday - 6th September - Much to my surprise it was a fine morning in Hastings. The weather remained fine going south to Ngaumu, even if there was snow on the side of the road in places.

Arrived at Golgotha about 11 a.m. Clear weather with a nice thin southerly wind coming direct from the very bowels of the Southern Alps, otherwise pleasant conditions.

Michael Alexander and myself had the same start times and decided to get to the start early and watch the others off. As we arrived at the start, a quick warning was given us by Dave Cooke "They want whistles", neither of us had them. A rapid dash back to a tent where whistles were available, told that they cost \$1 each. A faster dash to the car to get the whorewithal to purchase a couple of pealless Golgotha whistles. After all this, we finally reached the start with a couple of minutes to spare.

Right - it's all on, Ted gets tossed to Golgotha !

No. 1 I had to find this, it had my initials as the code. I managed to track it down, mainly because some old guy (M43 at least) was thoughtfully standing beside it taking a bearing. I thanked him for his assistance.

No. 2 After a bit of a forest ramble, I found this.

No. 3 This was precisely where it should have been - confidence starting to appear.

No. 4 Passed by Dave Holt who had just been abusive to himself in the unsuspected presence of a young lady, this may have accounted for his speed. Found my control eventually. Sun high in the sky now and filtering through the forest, rather pleasant.

No. 5 Slow going - area showed as marsh surprisingly dry, maybe I was somewhere else.

No. 6 Decided on positive action and tried to go direct. Directly managed to get lost. Must have spent close on an hour here. That part of the forest was a hive of activity with people dashing to and fro. I felt I was becoming a fixture in that particular vicinity and it took me 8 attempts to find that infuriating control. I learned a few lessons here.

No. 7 Found OK.

No. 8 Attacked this one scientifically followed a dead line with compass, going tree by tree - pace counting - checking landmarks as I passed them. When I got to where the control should have been, it wasn't. Ran a circle around the area and picked up my control.

No. 9 Still looking - I must confess - D. N. F. I don't know if there is any deep seated significance in this but in my fruitless search for the elusive 9, I saw my only skull of the day (non-human). Final point to Golgotha.

Much to my disgust I passed 10 and 11 on my way out. I finally left the forest near the finish after spending over three hours in it. It was then the weariness hit and I felt really tired. However, it only took the sight of Roger Bee walking up to meet me to restore my spirits.

It most probably sounds daft but I enjoyed my day. The post mortem showed where I made my major mistake with No. 9. As I said before, one up to Golgotha.
