CORRECT USE OF WHISTLES

Following an unfortunate incident during the Interclub in which a family was using whistles for communication, I have been requested to clarify the use of whistles at orienteering events.

A whistle should always be carried particularly in forests and is to be used only in emergencies i.e. when you have twisted your ankle, broken your leg, are suffering exposure or completely lost to the point of panic (not merely when you are unsure of your position).

On hearing a whistle a competitor MUST STOP IMMEDIATELY and go to the whistler's assistance.

If everyone follows these rules, the system will work. I am sure you wouldn't mind throwing away the competition to assist someone in genuine distress.

ORIENTEERING IN SWEDEN

The latest issue of the Taupo Club Newsletter contains a letter from Jim Lewis who is presently on a world Orienteering holiday. He was reporting on the Swedish 5 day "Oringen". Here are a few excerpts:-

There were 21,000 competitors from 29 countries in 94 classes. Although I arrived 3 days before the actual competition there were several thousand people already there, this was the largest orienteering competition the world has seen.

Each day had a brand new map. At the event competitors had anything up to 4½km walk to the start, there were five starts for each event. Each start would sent 16 people off at 1 minute intervals. Each map had out of bounds areas which were patrolled. All the wild animals (elk, moose etc) had been herded into these areas for their protection. Apparently with so many people running the game got confused and run away from the runners and some may actually die of exhaustion.

Overall I finished 211th out of 266 starters in my division - there were over 900 competitors in the M21B grade alone.

To think we got excited when we had 52 entries turn up for our O/Y 5 at Te Mata Park !!
