O Y COMPETITION - FORM REVEIW FOR SEPTEMBER 19

Points to date in this years H.B.O.C. competition are shown separately in this newsletter. Winners have been found in all but the M17-42 and M43 grades but minor placings will still be fiercely competed for.

In the W12 grade Fiona Sapsford continues to give Diana Smith a run for her money.

M12 grade: Russell Mardon continues to improve and it will be interesting to see if Mark Hyslop can keep him out.

W13-16: Fiona Crawford has made steady improvement this year and copped it off with a fine win last time out at Gwavas. Can she hold out the strong finish's of Leisl and Maree this time.

M13-16 Chris Smith has beaten Paul Fretchling earlier this season and it will be interesting to see if he can repeat the medicine at Gwavas.

W43-Anne Sapsford appears to have had things her own way at the last two events and it will be interesting to speculate on whether this grade attracts any other starters for this next event.

W17-42 'Johnny come lately' Jan Edgar has made giant strides this year and will be keen to redeem her last showing at Gwavas when things didn't exactly fall her way. Possible surprises in this grade could come from Jenny Mardon, Julie Watson and Sandra Tait all of whom missed the last start at Gwavas. Sandra Tait's strong showing at Kaahu could be the pointer here and Julie Watson's exploratory visits to Gwavas should stand her in good stead.

M43 Although this grade appears to be a 3 man affair improved performances from Ted Sapsford (only now starting to master the Gwavas Course) and Philip Mardon could see them improve their points substantially. A win here to Brian Crawford would give the series to Stewart Hyslop and Colin Tait must win to clinch the grade. Looks like a grandstand finish. Suggest place bets on all three although the odds won't be good.

M17-42 Local skill seems to be of assistance in this grade and Rodger Bee looks set to repeat the last Gwavas result. Look to Ken Ross for a strong showing and don't discard. David Holt from calculations after a recent return to form.

This years National Championships will be held in the picturesque Tarawera Forest near Kowerau during Labour Weekend. There are courses for all levels of orienteers so don't be put off by the label 'championship'. NATIONAL RELAY CHAMPIONSHIPS 1982

DATE: Monday 25 October 1982  
(Labour Weekend)

ORGANISERS: Hamilton Orienteering Club

VENUE: Kaahu-itī



The National Relays will be run this year on the Monday of Labour Weekend, the day after the National Championships at Tarawera Forest. The venue is a new one, adjacent to the Kaahu map where the NZ team Trial was held in June. Access is from the Whakamaru/Taupo highway, 5-10 mins South of Whakamaru.

TEAM GRADES:

Open M21A (men only)	7.7 km
Open W21A (women only)	4.8 km
M35 and over (men only)	4.8 km
W35 and over (women only)	4.0 km
Juniors 15 - 18 (mixed M/W allowed)	4.0 km
Juniors 14 and under (mixed M/W allowed)	2.4 km
Mixed A (no more than one M21A)	4.8 km, 4.0 km, 3.0 km
Mixed B (no M21A allowed)	4.0 km, 3.0 km, 2.5 km

Each team should be made up of 3 competitors. Apart from the Mixed A and B teams, each team member will have a leg of approximately the same length and difficulty.

Mixed A teams can be combinations of any grades, but no more than one M21A is allowed per team. Mixed B teams can also be of any combination but cannot include any M21A competitors.

Junior teams are divided by age only. For example, an M12, M13-14 and W13-14 could make up a Junior 14 and under team.

SINGLE ENTRIES:

It is expected that teams will be largely club-based, but non-club combinations are welcome. If you wish to enter but are unable to compile a team, put in a single entry and we will endeavour to fit you into a team with other single entrants. (If we are unable to, you can still have a run with 1st leg runners.)

ENTRY FEES: \$3.00 per entrant.

CLOSING DATE: Thursday 30 September 1982

A novice/wayfarer course will be available - entry on the day.

START TIMES:

10.00 am. onwards.

Each grade will be given a separate mass start, so that all M21A teams start together, all W35 teams together and so on, at reasonable intervals.

Any competitors still waiting to run by 1pm will be started then - even if their team mates have not yet finished.

ACCOMMODATION:

It is expected that most competitors will have attended the National Championships the day before and may be travelling from accommodation in Rotorua or that direction. Accommodation in Taupo may also be available, but if you have problems due to the pressure of Labour Weekend, we suggest that Tokoroa might be a good alternative to try. Contact Dave & Judy Browning at the Motel Mayfair (Best Western) - ph.TOK 67399.

Travelling times to venue: from Tokoroa 25 min; from Taupo 25 min; from Rotorua 55 min.

We suggest club secretaries circulate this information and compile appropriate teams with entry fees, but to allow for single entries and such, we would also appreciate publication of the entry form in newsletters.

THE AREA IS SIMILAR TO 'KAHU', EXCEPT THAT IT HAS FEWER LARGE HILLS AND MORE FLAT AREAS WITH PUMICE GULLIES. THE RUNNING IS EXCEPTIONALLY GOOD, AND FAST TIMES ARE EXPECTED. POSITIVE (OBVIOUS) CATCHING FEATURES ON THE COURSES WILL MEAN THAT IT WILL BE HARD TO GET 'LOST' AND IT IS CONSIDERED A GOOD AREA FOR LESS-THAN-CONFIDENT ORIENTEERS.

SO BE IN IT - RELAYS ARE FAST, EXCITING AND FUN.

N.Z.O.F. BADGE AWARD SCHEME

This is an Orienteering award in which there are four levels - Gold, Silver, Bronze and Iron, which can be won by orienteers affiliated to the N.Z.O.F. Credits towards the badges may be competed for at events nominated by the N.Z.O.F. as Badge Events.

Competitors must qualify at the required level in three badge events before applying for the appropriate badge. Once an event has been used to claim qualification towards a specific grade it cannot be used to claim towards any other grade, except (a) Badge credits gained by Juniors in their first year in a new age grade may be used to complete an award in the previous grade, and (b) Badge credits at a higher level than that for which a badge is claimed may be used again when the higher award is completed. Credits obtained if a competitor runs up a grade may be accepted as counting to a badge in the lower grade.

Example : 1980 credits in M13-14 events B, B, S - Bronze badge can be claimed  
 1981 credit in M15-16 event S  
 1981 credit in M17-18 event S - Silver badge can be claimed  
 in M15-16.

Badge credits are only obtainable by competitors running individually. There must be three or more entrants competing in the particular grade before a credit at Gold, Silver or Bronze can be obtained. However if fewer than three people finish in a particular grade, a badge credit can still be obtained by comparing their times with the next grade up, providing they ran the same course.

Qualifying times for the four levels are :-

Gold Badge : A Grade - Winner's time plus 12.5% rounded up to the nearest whole minute.

Silver Badge : A Grade - Winner's time plus 25% rounded up to the nearest whole minute.

B Grade - Winner's time plus 12.5% rounded up to the nearest whole minute.

Bronze Badge : A Grade - Winner's time plus 37.5% rounded up to the nearest whole minute.

B Grade - Winner's time plus 25% rounded up to the nearest whole minute.

Iron Badge : Three completed events.

Applications for badges should be sent to the National Statistician, Mr J. Denyer, 83 Colwill Road, Massey, Auckland 8, with a list of the events at which the qualifications were gained, together with the badge fee of \$2.50.

#### The Third Big 'C' Relay at Te Mata

Initiated in 1980 with 29 teams competing, the relay has proved an exciting introduction to Orienteering for a number of Hawkes Bay people. With the donation of three cups for this event last year it has stimulated a competitive spirit amongst the schools of the Napier-Hastings area of Hawkes Bay, and possibly in the future schools from further afield will take up the challenge. Karamu and Hastings Girls High teams are each trying to make it "Hat Trick" year this year.

The five groupings of the first two years' events have been expanded to seven, and are as follows: A Novice, B Mixed, C Men, D Ladies, E Youth (13 & under), F School Team Boys, and G School Team Girls.

The objects are to encourage 'non orienteers' to have a go at this fun day to experience the thrill of orienteering especially in a relay situation with team spirit and spectators and all. To enable businesses or clubs an opportunity to get a bit of free publicity in the results, and a challenge to the participants to better their traditional rivals' performance, and to provide serious orienteers with a chance to test their skills in a competitive relay situation.
