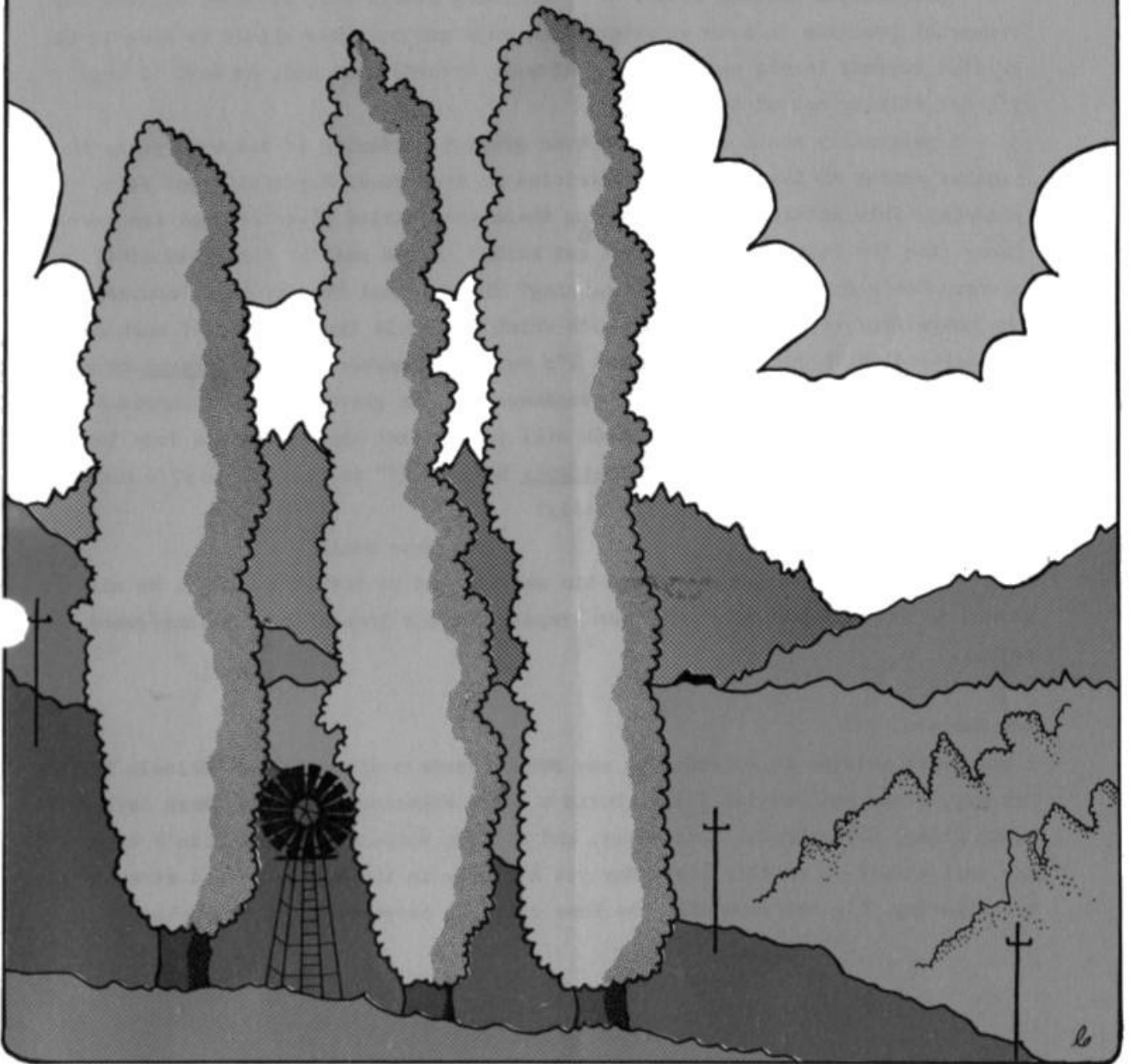

Participants have to enter all three events (on the day entry) to be eligible for trophies, so mention to the registration or course setter that you are taking part. The events are;

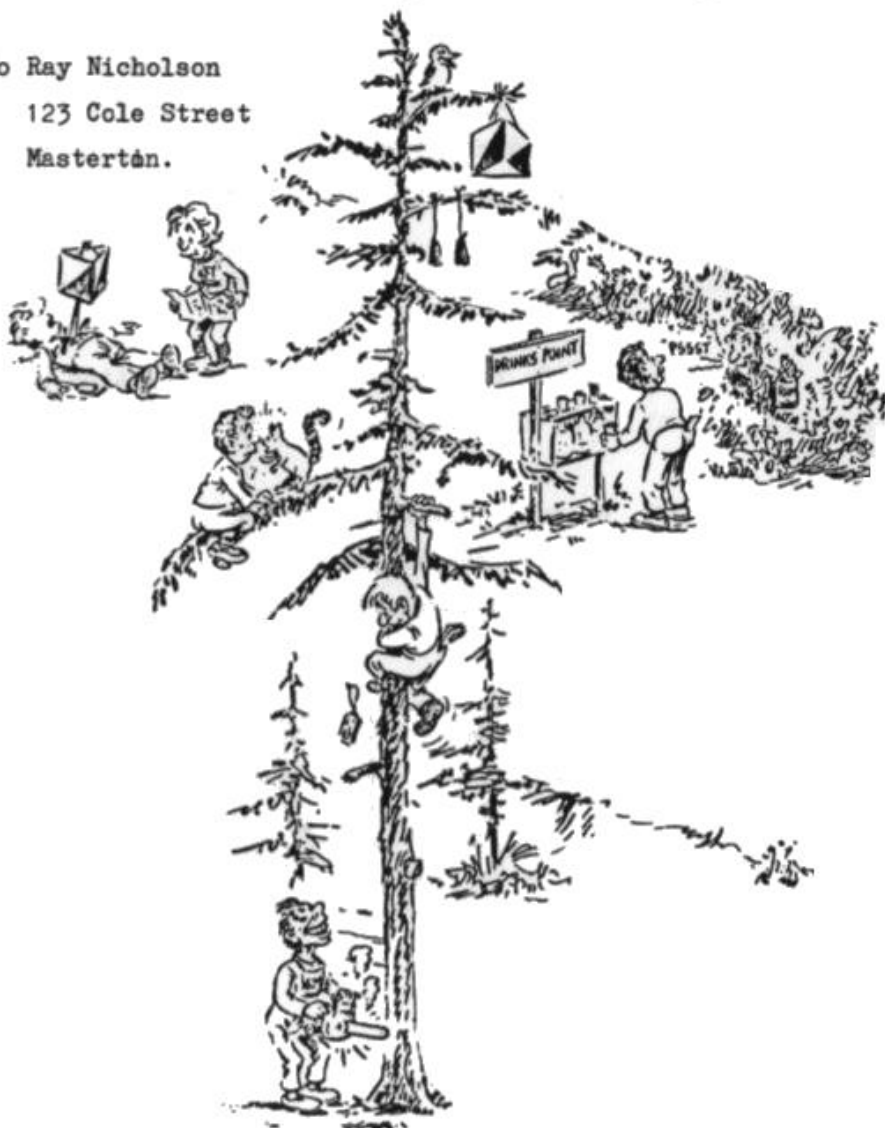

Hawkes Bay's Loss- Aucklands Gain

Another of the veteran families is preparing to move on. Due to a professional promotion, Colin Tait and family are heading away to Auckland. To say they will be missed is an understatement, as their contribution to our club has been substantial in many spheres.

The Tait's decided to try their hand at Orienteering in 1978, liked it and stayed. After learning how to find his way around a map Colin decided to check out the administration of the club - and stayed there too.

In 1982 the fledgeling Hawkes Bay Club decided to hold its first Badge Event the N.Z. Trial at Gwavas Forest. Colin was the Co-Ordinator at this event, and it was an outstanding success. In one weekend the H.B.O.C. proved their maps, course setting and organisation were second to none in N.Z. Orienteering. This event forged a team which went on to host several more successful Badge Events with increasing expertise.

The Tait touch extends further into than club level as Colin has been the elected Secretary of the N.Z.O.F. in 1984 - 1985 - 1986 and as such has been on the Executive of the N.Z.O.F. for that period. In 1985 he was appointed N.Z. Team Manager of the N.Z. Orienteering team that toured Australia and took part in the World Championships.

A man can only do as much as his occupation and family permit. Here is Colin's strength. Bev has supplied that with her continued support and encouragement. You can be sure to find her cheerfully assisting in the background in her quiet way. Colin's contribution is obvious but it is the result of an understanding partnership.

I first met Colin at Pakowhai Park in 1980. My second event, and searching for an elusive control (the story of my Orienteering), Colin ran past, noticed me floundering around and recognising me for a new chum, stopped, assisted me, then continued on his way. Practical assistance to novices and anyone who needed it has always been readily forthcoming. His own Orienteering has always been of a competitive standard with the yearly run off between Stewart Hyslop and Colin for the M43 and M45 OY points.

Like the rest of us he has also made some beautiful blues. Ngaumu Forest, that area of lost souls: we attended the Wellington Champs there in 1982. Colin started ahead of me. I got my first three controls Bang! Bang! Bang!. Carried on with great gusto and confidence to gradually slow down as I realized I did not have the foggiest idea where I was. I finally stopped, sat on a rock to contemplate the situation when Colin burst out of the scrub beside me. The subsequent dialogue went something like this.

"Colin- "Where are we?"      Me "I dunno".      Colin "Well what are you doing here?"

Me "Not a hell of a lot. What are you doing here?" Colin with a grin, "I followed you from 3"..... After period of mutual hilarity we joined forces and retraced our way to the part of the forest that was actually on the map and eventually completed our course.

This was not the last time we joined forces, as we teamed up for 3 Mountain Marathons and shared several tramping forays into the ranges and Tongariro National Park. It was an enjoyable partnership and produced some memorable experiences and some very funny ones as well.

On behalf of us all I wish the Tait family all the best for the future and thanks for being here.

An interesting scoring system is detected in this event. 10 9 8 7 6 5 4 3 2 1 points for the first ten within each course.

Where there are less than ten it appears from course 5 that possibly the first place may have gone to SA? but only 4 points while the next three may have got 3 2 1?

Perhaps at Granules we could apply the system for fun. A local intertown allocation could be interesting too. Obviously it'd be useful in school situations.



## ORIENTEERING AT CAMP.

- OBJECTS:
- (i) To help familiarize pupils with immediate environment.
  - (ii) To create excitement while exercising.
  - (iii) To increase ability to interpret map symbols.
  - (iv) To increase pupils' personal confidence (ensuring they receive praise in the achievements of controls located.)
  - (v) To develop fast eye, foot, hand co-ordination.
  - (vi) To acquaint pupils with the sport of orienteering.

METHOD: Using a basic map of the area which has plenty of landmarks close to the lineal features (i.e. close to roads, tracks, streams, fences), several controls (preferably proper Orienteering flags with clipper - but any suitable object with an identifying symbol, letter, number is alright) are placed within the area of the map on or attached to actual features that appear on the map (be they treestump, fallen log, tree, or the lineal features themselves, etc.) in such a position that makes them easily sighted by the competitors who for a SCORE event may visit the controls in any order they choose, using any route they chose or for a normal CROSS COUNTRY event visit the controls in the proper numerical order, but this style needs a staggered start - pupils setting off at say intervals of 1 or 2 mins apart. The SCORE event style was the preferred one for this camp when each participant had a map which they proceeded to circle control sites upon, from the Master Maps provided. When everyone was ready for the MASSED START and instructions given about collecting a numbered card at the finish line upon which the pupil printed his/her name and the clip checker noted the score achieved i.e. at 10 points per control visiting correctly making 80 points for the total of eight controls placed by the course setter. The above event was without compasses!

FURTHER INSTRUCTION: for those who were keen to learn about the use of the compass - instruction was given immediately after completing the score event.

- (i) Quick orienting of the map. i.e. the pointed end of swinging needle to be pointing in same direction as magnetic north lines and parallel to same.
- (ii) Turning the compass housing to compute the desired travel direction.

PAIRS RETRIEVAL: The following day pairs of pupils of like ability mainly paired from the results of the previous day i.e. First and second place getters making the first pair. Second placegetter took the map from the previous day and one control flag and placed it on a feature of his/her choosing. Upon his return the first placegetter (now his pair) attempted to locate the flag and bring it back, using the map and circle placed (in different coloured ink from previous course) in the correct position. Excitement seemed to be sustained despite the rain soaking and almost obliterating the map so that almost 4 or 5 turns at placing the flag seemed to be the norm amongst the 5 pairs that participated in this.

SUMMARY: Excitement; exercise, confidence, map reading and familiarisation with locality all seemed to be achieved - but one map per pupil should be aimed at in future attempts.

The above set out a few of my thoughts after an Intermediate S J1 (Hastings) three day camp at Awhina Te Waka which is on the plateau immediately above the township of Te Pohue (on the Napier Taupo Road.) At a previous camp there I mapped the small but interesting area close by the camp.

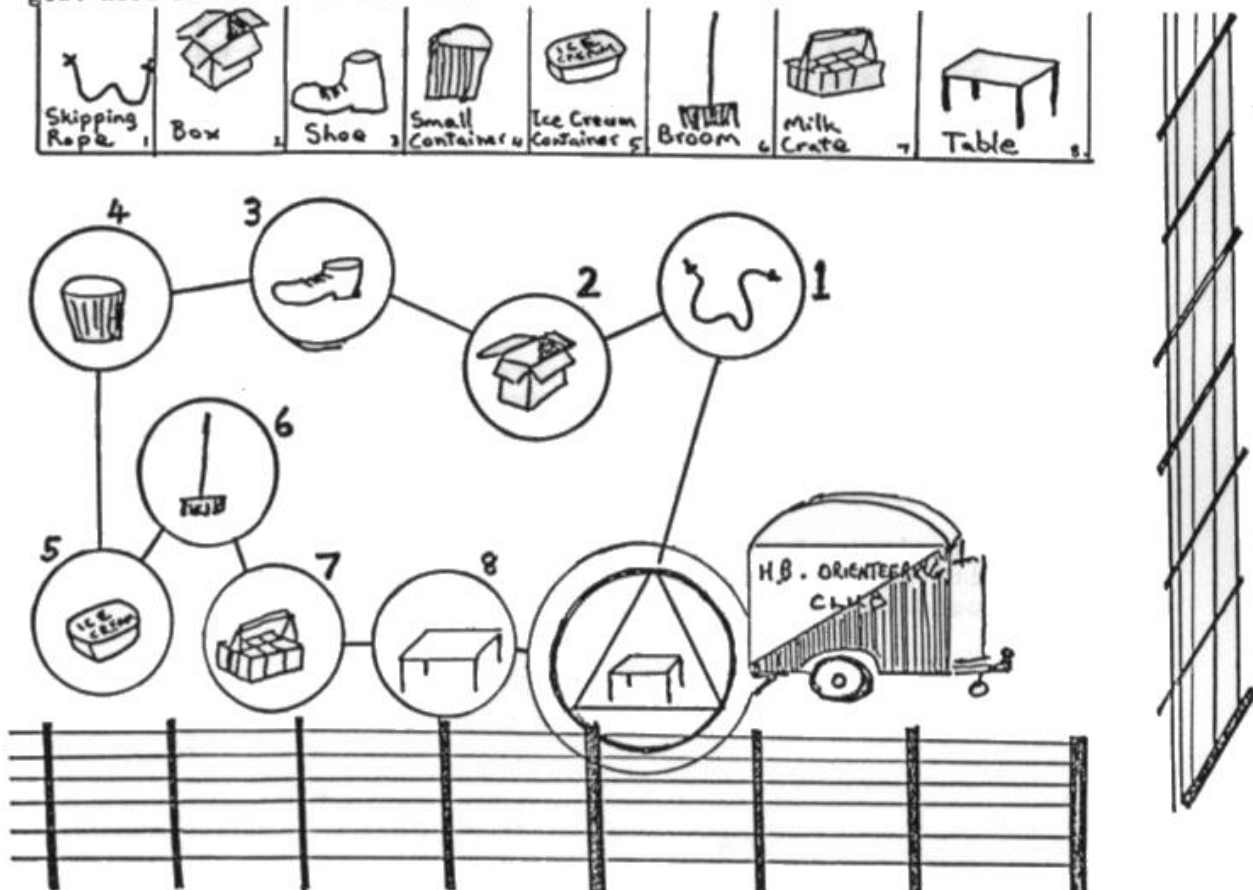
Was that surprise that registered on the Rural Delivery driver's face when he/she delivered the envelope with the address that started;

## Picture Course at Rowe Road (or anywhere for that matter)

Many references in overseas magazines are keen to point out that the very young can recognise a picture far more readily than letters or numbers. While these sentiments are normally aimed at the markings on the flags at control points, which are on natural or man made features, for my little experiment at Rowe Road where no such features were available apart from the fences, I cheated and brought from home ready-made man-made objects as can be seen from this reduced copy of the MAP. I suppose you may argue it is not a map, where are the magnetic north lines, where is the scale? What does such a course teach anyone?

I feel the benefits that can be said to have been gained by the children who clipped their way around this very tiny course (set out and controlled by Cathy Smith and Linley Black both 9yrs and Peter Smith 12yrs) are;

Direction- in relation to other objects.

Clipping- in the correct box, as a skill in itself (where to put the paper, how hard to press, perhaps lower standards would have been better for size)

Starting/Finish- very simple, no writing by the competitors who possibly may be too young to write anyway-conversing with start personell who are not Overawing Giants.

Matching- the picture to the object, first finding on the ground and then the correct box for clipping.

Circles- item searched for is in the circle, which is numbered for those who can read numbers.

Triangle- Although drawn on the map was not over emphasised?

Double circle- Finish sybol, ditto?

Completion of course should give satisfaction and praise and support from parents and playmates.

Size of map was A4 (original drawing by felt pen on A3).

Control Standards did not have a flag on them (no picture sort available) The close proximity of each control did not warrant easier siting.

Line of sight control placement.

#### Tree Run

A single tree on the skyline above the finish area was a natural to burn off a little excess energy. Several children attempted this one control course, no map.

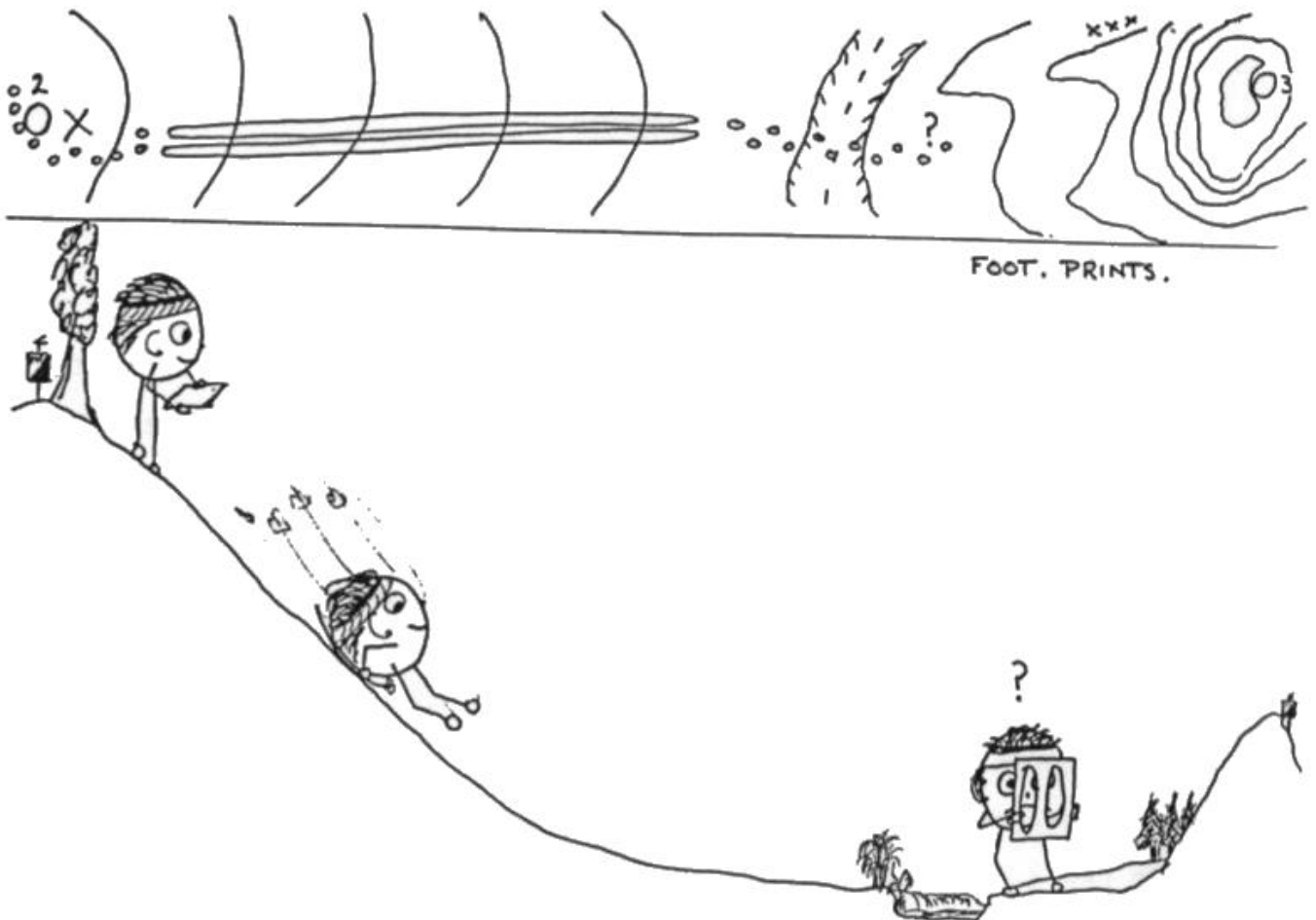
