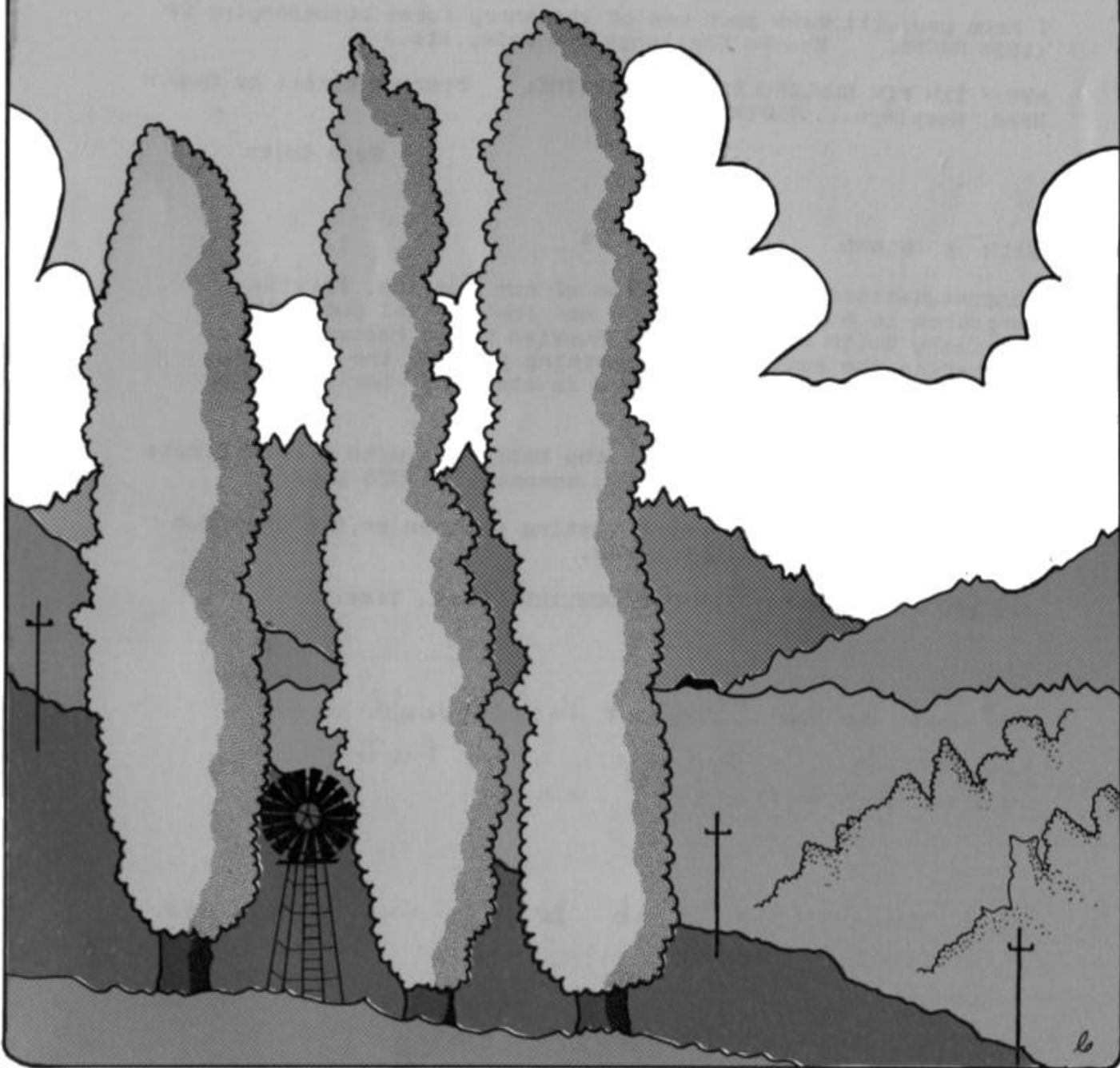

## HOW AND WHERE TO BUY PETROL

The dedicated orienteers travel long distances to be able to compete on different maps and hone their orienteering skills to a point that they hope is not too far from perfection.

Events that are at great distances from home are easier to attend than events closer at hand simply because the more triffling details of travel are left to somebody else. You merely have to pack your bags and turn up at the pre-arranged spot to be picked up and flown/bused away to the event. Arriving at the event you are relaxed and can concentrate on the orienteering, on the way home you can review the days efforts without worrying about the outside world.

When the event is closer to home you become inundated with a mass of triffling details all requiring careful thought, while all you want to do is prepare for the event. After determining the optimum route to get to the event, checking for flat tyres and navigating around all the obstacles other road users create and then finding a place to park the car, that is close enough to the start and yet not too muddy, you hardly stand a chance of running a brilliant time.

After the event you now have to repeat all the triffling details to get back home.

NEVER buy petrol at the first petrol station in a town, just remember the price. If the second station is cheaper, take it. If not, wait for the third. If the third is more expensive CARRY ON to the next town, DO NOT GO BACK.

The interclub event against the Red Kiwis Manawatu will be held near Bulls on 17 Sept.

When the map was originally drawn the large green areas in South east and South West were included as they were to be thinned in the future, and could perhaps be used at a later date.

In 1988 thinning had started on the South West block so it was hoped at last, we would be able to use this area. In fact only a small part had been touched and blackberry was fast taking it over. However the new road into the middle gave access to a spur leading to the top of the ridge which in turn led to the skid track down the far side. This route became the middle section of the A and B courses.

It is always difficult to set D and E courses at Crohane but we solved the E course by using the very intricate open area mapped by Mac Fisher. We intended to use the track through the S.E. right for the D course but when checking it from the south end, missed the left turn off due to the many skid tracks and eventually got completely lost. We put a control on this corner to prevent anyone else doing the same thing but decided it was still too risky so changed the D course to run in the opposite direction over this section. We thought the C course could manage it (especially with our warning on the blackboard), but at least one missed the old route, dropped off the side of the saddle on a new track and came out beside the control at the pit. - Very clever Sharon!

Perhaps we got carried away just a little bit and made the courses slightly too long but we did have our problems. After checking the fifth control site, Neil commented that each one had to be changed and was that going to happen to the lot? Those who had problems with the control on the spur above the swamp should have seen the original site - and you COULD get across the swamp dryfooted!

We hope you enjoyed the courses as much as we did planning them and it was good to see so many of our Taupo friends again. Course Setters Neil Laurence Brian Crauford

The final hill climb may have seemed unnecessary but if you examined your maps carefully you would see that the saddle on the eastern edge of the map was only three contours higher than the final control.

The 'F' Course was intended to be a sight-seeing course but due to the conditions, turned into a battle against the elements.
