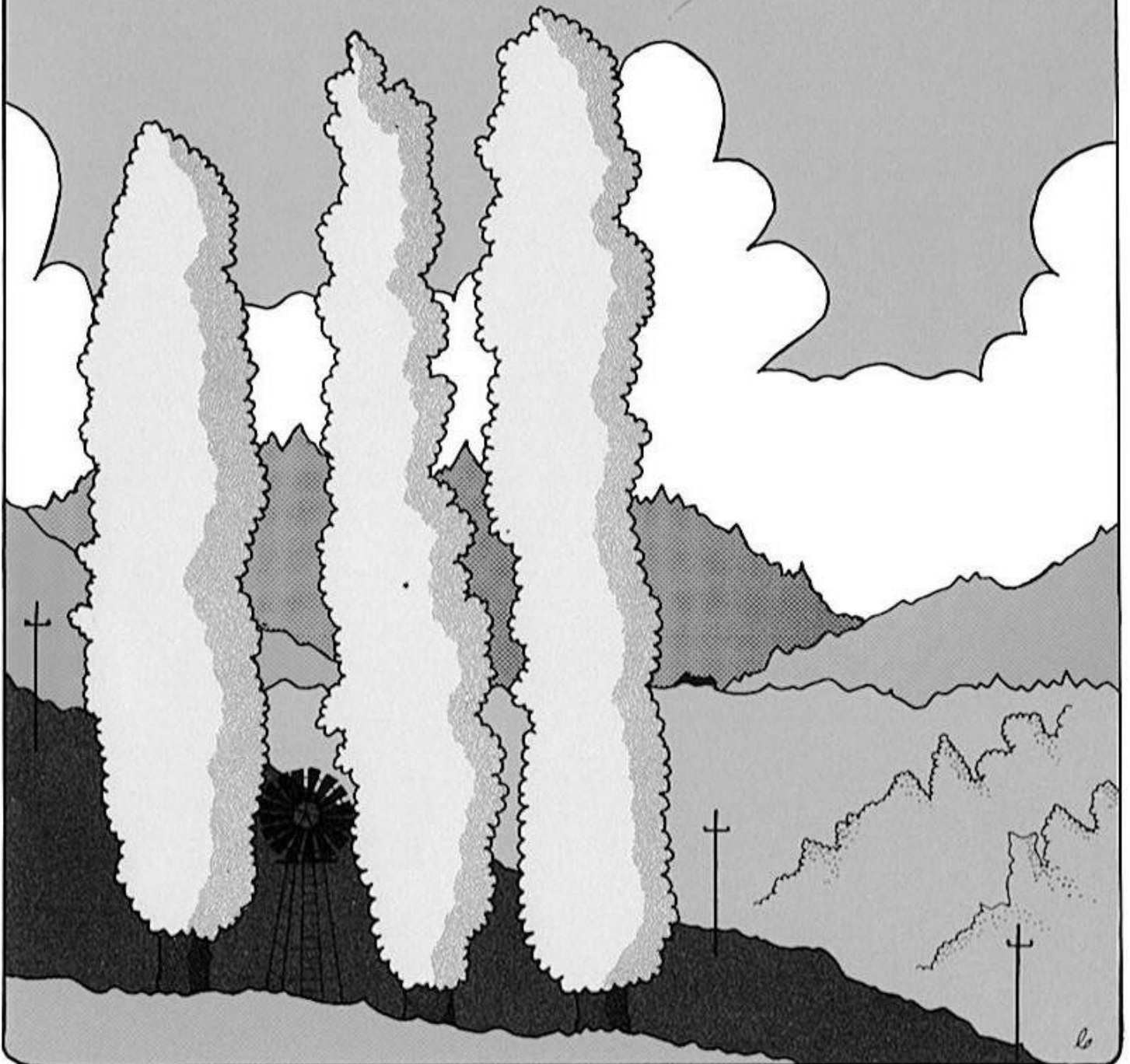

STOCK MOVEMENT

We had a report at GRANULES of a cattle beast being frightened, and jumping or crashing over a fence. Breaking a post in the process. At a guess this may have been a result of several scares to the animal.

As orienteers we have to be very careful when approaching stock, and I think Rule No. 1 is to go round them not through them. Be particularly wary of cows and calves. They do not like being separated.

Try to leave the animals somewhere to go, as opposed to pushing them into a corner or down a steep face.

I have written and spoken to the owner about the incident, asking for an assessment of any damage, but we must try to avoid this sort of thing at all costs.

REPORT ON THE N.Z.O.F. A.G.M. ON 30TH MARCH 1991

I am not a born reporter and as I prefer to join in at any meeting I attend, this is written from the barest of notes scribbled during the one and a half hours of the meeting on Saturday afternoon.

There was no nomination for Chairman, Vice Chairman or Publicity so these positions are still vacant. Chrissie Williams (P.A.P.O) is our new Secretary and Barry Foote remains as Treasurer. The meeting agreed with Barry's suggestion to increase the affiliation fees by 12.1/2% as G.S.T. now applies to the N.Z.O.F. and also to increase the event levy to 11%, only H.B. voting against the latter.

The Fixtures Card has become too dear to print and will be replaced by an A4 page suitable for club magazines which can be updated during the year as necessary. Mapsport is "at risk" as Bill Teahan has too big a workload to carry on as editor. He suggests four area editors, each supplying three pages per issue and taking it in turn to produce four issues per year.

The Ampro Set of Compasses went to Central who had a 39% increase in members (Hawke's Bay had 14%) and the Silva Award for the hardest worker during the year went to Bryan Teahan (N.W.)_

Mike Ashmore's remit to scrap all relays at the 'NATIONALS' weekend was rejected by 29 votes to 20, and only P.A.P.O. supported our Rogaine idea. So we will be running the National Relays on Day 3 after all, but the grades are open to improvement to increase the Club Team Spirit.

Finally we got a nice cheer when I commented that we hope to run a 24 hour Rogaine next year. "Orienteering must be thriving in Hawke's Bay."

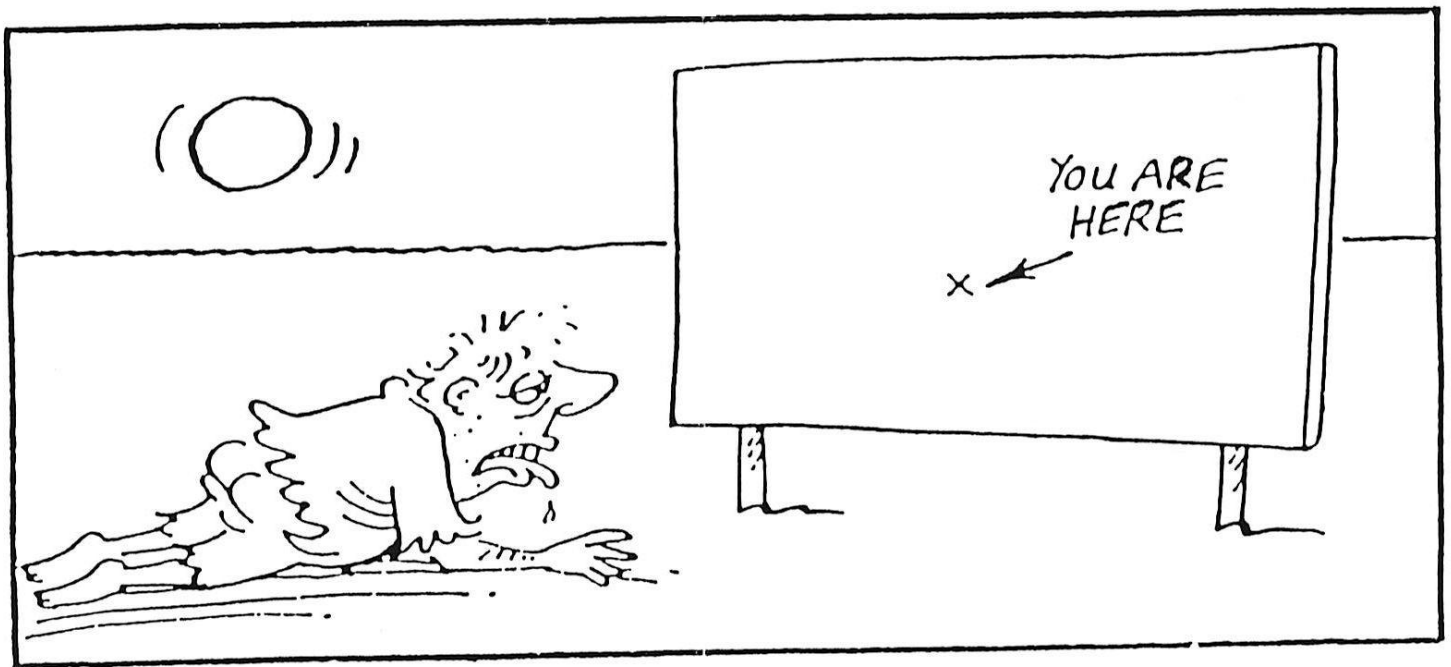

TRIALS AT TE MATA

After the usual amount of procrastination I agreed to set Te Mata in May.

A couple of weeks before the event I went out to the Peak to check various control sites. What a performance. Clay bird shooting en masse on the edge of the map about 500 metres away from a battalion of small bore people blasting away at sundry targets. Somehow I had to get through these martial groups, without tempting them with a moving target! REPORT ON JUNCTION




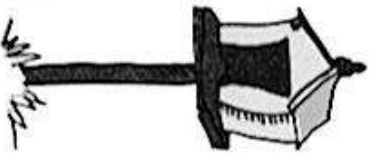
