Affiliation

All entrants must either be affiliated to the NZ Orienteering Federation through their Club or pay a single event levy each day of \$9 Senior, \$5.50 Junior and \$23.50 Family, as well as their entry fee. This does not apply to overseas orienteers affiliated to their own national orienteering organisations.

Late Entry

Late entries will be accepted at the organisers discretion. Entries postmarked after the closing date of 24 September, will incur a late entry fee of 10%.

The National Interclub Relays will be contested between Club based teams in the following classes.

Legs will be run in the order shown, lengths are approximate.

Relay Rules

Competitors may run officially only for the club of which they are NZOF affiliated. If a competitor is a member of another club, he/she may run officially for that club if they have written approval from their NZOF affiliated club.

Any club that has fewer than 30 affiliated members of NZOF may, for the purpose of the relays, amalgamate with another club, or clubs, in a similar situation. This should be done through an official request to the coordinators by the secretaries of both clubs. Joint teams affiliated to NZOF through these clubs will be regarded as official and the team shall be known as the "X-Y team" with X and Y being the names of the amalgamated clubs. Any club with fewer than nine individual entries at the event may similarly amalgamate with another club as described above.

An overseas competitor must have three months' continuous residency before the first day of competition to be eligible to run officially in a NZ Club team.

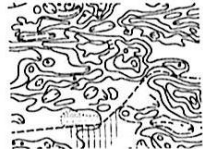

Tune on a Dune in December

Dune Tune Preliminary Information

Location: Waitarere Forest, coastal sand-dunes in Manawatu. The forest is adjacent to the village of Waitarere Beach, 15km from Levin.

Date: 11-12 December, 99

Status: C-level event with pre-entry. This means the NZOF rules are only a guide, but we'll be doing our best to provide a rehearsal of your big-race routines. Some labour-saving ideas which will not compromise the orienteering.

Organiser: Hutt Valley Orienteering Club, a member of the NZOF

Personnel: As a "shoestring" event the roles will be blurred. Michael Wood is the "Overall Controller" as defined in the rules. Chief planner is Chris Gelderman and the Coordinator Scott van Dyk.

Day 1: "A Map Called Wanda". Course lengths similar to WMOC qualification races. Start times 12-2pm

Coastal sand-dunes typical of Manawatu. From the coast, vegetation consists of open dunes, unthinned windbreak pines, radiata pine production forest of various ages, farmland with blocks of radiata. Mapped 1997 by Bryan Teahan, used once for NZ Short-O Champs 1997, vegetation check 1999 Chris Gelderman. Scale 1:10,000, contours 2.5m.

Day 2: "Someone's Stolen the Watchtower". Course lengths similar to WMOC final race. Start times 10-12am

Coastal sand-dunes typical of Manawatu. Vegetation consists of unthinned windbreak pines or young macrocarpa, radiata pine production forest, very clean, more of the same with fingers of farmland, and farmland with numerous marshes. Original 1993 map completely reworked 1999 on 2.5m photogrammetry by Michael Wood. Nothing like the previous 5m edition - more forest, less green. Scale 1:10,000, contours 2.5m.

Locality Information

The two maps are immediately to the north of Waitarere Beach village. This is largely a holiday resort but has a significant permanent population including a rest home. It has a service station, small grocery/dairy, and café. There are two motor camps, called "Waitarere Beach" and "Hydrabad". Levin 15km away on SH 1, is a provincial town of 10,000 people with many more facilities.

A feature of Waitarere is the wreck of the "Hydrabad", whose rusting steel remains are visible on the beach about 1km south of the village. The beach is used for swimming but we can't guarantee safety. Other orienteering maps in the area include Kapiti's "Hydrabad" to the south of the village, and various Red Kiwi "Waitarere" maps to the north.

Dune Tune Courses and Classes

We are primarily trying to set WMOC-length courses. We think that we'll get an approximation using something like 85 and 100% of NZ single-day target times. But bear in mind that we'll be using world-standard k-rates to get the distances.

We'll use the NZOF 10-course combination without M21E, which makes 9 courses. Note that this combination uses 10-year age groups, eg 45's run in M or W40 and 35's in M or W21A. If you feel this would be too long for you, feel free to choose A-Short or B or in fact any course you like, this is not a championship.

We've given you distances below based on a hypothetical Course 1 of 15km. This may be adjusted as we firm up the courses.
