Age Classes

Competitors aged 20, or younger, belong to each class up to the end of the calendar year in which they reach the given age. They are entitled to compete in older classes up to and including 21. Competitors aged 21, or older, belong to each class from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the given age. They are entitled to compete in younger classes down to and including 21.

Affiliation

All entrants must be affiliated to the National Federation through their Club. Persons not affiliated to the NZ Orienteering Federation through their Club must pay a single event levy each day of \$9 Senior, \$5.50 Junior and \$23.50 Family as well as their entry fee.

This does not apply to overseas orienteers affiliated to their own national orienteering organisations.

The Rules for the National Interclub Relay Championships are:

- Except as allowed below competitors may only run officially for the club through which they affiliated to NZOF in that year. If a competitor is a member of another club, they may run officially for this club if they have approval from the club through which they affiliated.
- Any club which has fewer than 30 affiliated members of NZOF may for the purpose of the relays, form an amalgamation with another club, or clubs, in a similar situation. This will be done through an official request to the Co-ordinators by the secretaries of both clubs. Joint teams of orienteers affiliated to NZOF through these clubs will be regarded as official and the team shall be known as the "X-Y team" with X and Y being the names of the amalgamated clubs.
- Any club with fewer than 9 individual entries at the event may similarly form an amalgamation with another club as described above. (This is mainly intended to cover the case of South Island clubs when the event is in the North Island and vice versa)
- An overseas orienteer must have 3 months continuous residency before the first day of competition to be eligible to run officially in a NZ Club team.

Entry Details

Age Classes

Competitors aged 20, or younger, belong to each class up to the end of the calendar year in which they reach the given age. They are entitled to compete in older classes up to and including 21. Competitors aged 21, or older, belong to each class from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the given age. They are entitled to compete in younger classes down to and including 21.

Affiliation

All entrants must be affiliated to the National Federation through their Club. Persons not a member of a Club must pay a single event levy each day of \$9 Senior, \$5:50 Junior and \$23:50 Family as well as their entry fee. This does not apply to overseas orienteers affiliated to their own national orienteering organisations.

Unofficial Entries

Individuals who choose to enter a class that they are not entitled to, are deemed to be unofficial, examples are a 37 year old male entering in a M40 class race, or a 14 year old girl entering a W-12 race. See below for late entries.

Late Entries

Entries close on 30th September.

Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the organisers. The late entry fee is \$10. Changes of grade after closing date will also incur a \$10 penalty fee. A late entry may be deemed unofficial by the race organiser.
