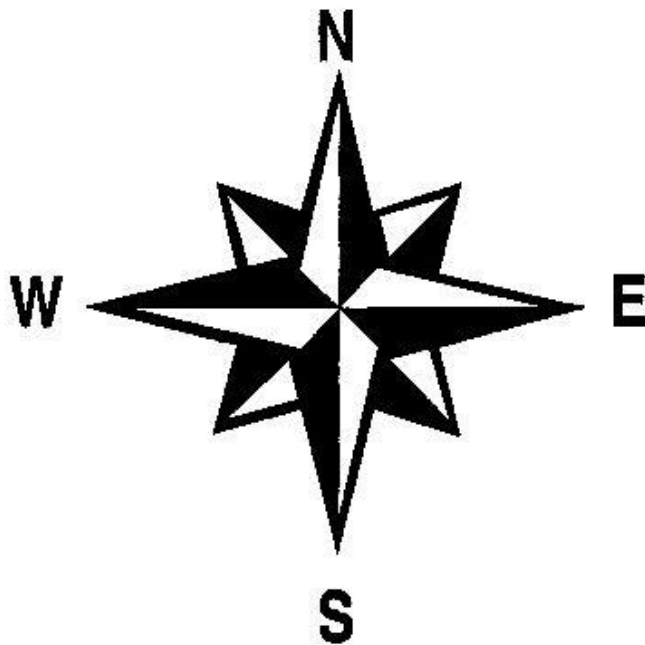

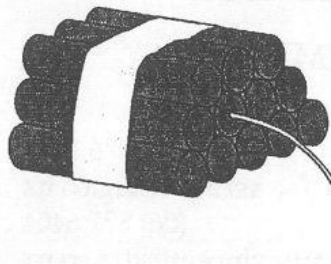

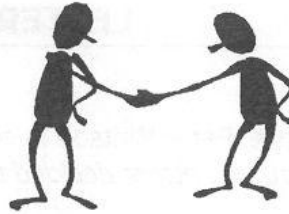

HAWKE'S BAY ROGAINE

Saturday, December 7, 2002

Enjoy the outdoors? Whether you're ultra-competitive or just enjoy exploring the countryside, then a rogaïne is for you. You'll be travelling by foot in a team (of 2 – 5 people), using a 1:50,000 scale map to navigate to control points. Each control has a pre-allocated score value and the object is to locate as many controls as possible within the time allowed, to maximise your total score.

WHERE IS IT? We have selected a very spectacular piece of Hawke's Bay countryside, off the beaten track, for you to explore. The rogaïne is being held in the Puketitiri area, which is approximately 60km north - west of Napier. There will be camping (including hot showers) available at the event centre on Friday (from 5.00pm) and Saturday nights.

Subject: **Australian Relay Championships 3rd October 2002.**

Further to my previous articles regarding the NZ relays(2 three person teams either Mixed Long & Mixed Short) and the Canadian Relays(3 sections handicapped by age and gender into 4 person teams) we have a new animal in the Australian Relays.

The Australians have a grade for everyone and compete by State. They generously allow overseas teams to compete but(and this a big but)only if they come from the same club. The NZ organisers basically ignored that rule and organised unofficial teams by ability which to me is as useful as putting sun-block on to watch TV inside. I tried to organise two official HB teams but was not successful, leaving Oliver (9), Helen (just 12) and me (M45) to find a grade.

The only grade suitable was Senior Mixed so Oliver ran course 10 (the lowest course but a yellow course), Helen course 4 (W20A) and I ran course 2 (M40).

We were competing against an underwhelming two other teams, but completing the course was our priority. We were also using electronic punching which increases the chance of mis-punching as you must remember which control you have got up to. Oliver led out and returned a concerning 46.24 minutes later which released Helen into the unknown. To the surprise of most people she completed the first 4 long controls (which was 50% of the course) without much drama, but had a big miss at number 5 at which point Amber Morrison caught her up (Amber started 10 minutes ahead of Helen). Helen was strong enough to hang onto Amber for the rest of the course with Helen checking to ensure Amber was going the correct way (these were Helen's words!). Helen finished with a time of 75.54 to Amber's 78.58 and but (a very common word in orienteering) for control 5, would have been under an hour for her 5.61km course.

I completed course 2 in 50.47 minutes, but was 5 minutes too late which put us in second place.

Of the 100 or so NZ entries we were only one of two officially placed teams so we were very happy to complete the relay successfully.

Congratulations to Helen Watson for winning the W12 title at the Australian Championships. This could very well be the first time a HB junior has won an Australian title.

Other commendable placings in other events in Australia were by Oliver Watson, Amber Morrison and Hayley Oates.

Hawke's Bay juniors dominated the grades at the recent Wellington Champs classic, with Jaime Goodwin (W12), Duncan Morrison (M12), Chris McDonald (M12), Rachel Goodwin (W14), Scott McDonald (M14), Emma Watson (W16), Hayley Oates (W16), Amber Morrison (W18) all winning one or more days in their grades.

Scott McDonald also featured in the HB Intermediate Schools cross-country, with a 2nd placing.

ROWE ROAD OY6

It can be really hard to sit down and write an event report without sounding either very ho-hum, factual and dreary or far too ebullient when the deadline is pressing and you just know that the editor is likely to call any time. So if this is a bit gushy, please forgive me. If on the other hand you find it dreary, then put me out of my misery and relieve me of any further event reporting.

The essence of a good event as we all know actually has nothing whatsoever to do with the map, the setter, the controller or any other part of orienteering over which we have control. No, the essence of a good event is solely attributable to the vagaries of the weather. As the club found out this year, there can be a significant effect on turnout and enjoyment when the weather is less than benign. Does this mean we have just been lucky over the last few years? How often does HBOC actually have to run an event in the rain (apart from those that are cancelled or totally washed out)? I would like to suggest (without trying to tempt fate) that we have been smiled upon for the last decade or so and therefore things can only go downhill from here. HB is going to be a cold, wet, overcast and thoroughly miserable place to be in the next decade. (About now is when those of eligible age should be reaching for their glass of Tui).

Of course you may say that I have a jaundiced view of the weather given the events of this spring and the severe effects on the horticultural industry at large, but it actually raises a serious issue. For those in the retail sector there will be less money spent by horticulturists in the next twelve months. Of course all of this was completely preventable. What we needed was a bit of warm air. So that really begs the question, where was Richard Lynn in our time of need?

As the more astute of you may have realised by now, I intend to write this report without mentioning the place that shall not be named. I could go through the results and tell you of margins and errors. As usual, those who won already know it and those who made mistakes know how bad the errors were (and have probably navigated their through those fateful controls in their sleep on more than one occasion, waking up in a cold sweat at how basic the error was). I do apologise for the uphill finish, but then if you can't run yourself, you may as well take the opportunity to make the rest suffer where you can see it! The farms were in perfect condition for fast orienteering, with short grass and firm footing for all courses. There were some standout performances. Congratulations to Geoff Morrison who raced his way round the Red Medium course and finished fourth. Aari Barrett cleaned out in the Yellow, beating all by nearly 10 minutes. Bob Pocknall had another good run to win Orange by 7 minutes. Red long had its closest finish of the year, with just 1 min 20s

separating first from third. Amber Morrison had another good run to beat Pamela home by just under a minute.

Thanks to Alan Berry without whose help it would not have happened. Thank you to Lyn & Gary Bowcock for their help on the day. Thanks to Helen & Caroline for their incomparable help in the caravan. Thank you to David & Patsy Douglas and John Field for the use of their farms.
