A MOVE TO CDOA?

At the club AGM this issue was raised for discussion. It was decided that a general meeting should be called to debate and vote on the issue. I will attend to the formal procedure in relation to this meeting after the holidays, and would like to see the meeting held in early February. Below I have outlined the issues.

During a discussion at the last NZOF Council meeting a suggestion was put forward that the Central Districts Association (CDOA) would benefit from a transfer of Hawke's Bay. Hawke's Bay is presently a member of the Wellington Association (WOA).

What led to this suggestion being made?

CDOA is presently the smallest regional association in NZ orienteering and there are presently some things happening within the region that are going to place considerable pressure on the two most active clubs, Hamilton and Rotorua, especially in relation to the hosting of major events.

What is happening in CDOA?

Taupo Club has been an active club in the CD event rotation, due to a small core of hard-working and dedicated members. Unfortunately, these members are feeling disillusioned and weary so Taupo will not be hosting any major events in the foreseeable future.

Egmont Club has signalled a desire to move to WOA. They have one or two maps near Wanganui and this year hosted a WOA OY so seem to have positioned themselves for a future within WOA. Unfortunately, this leaves the remaining CD clubs in a very difficult position for major event rotation.

What will it mean for Hawke's Bay?

A move to CDOA will mean that HB enters into a major event rotation with Hamilton and Rotorua and by doing so it ensures the survival of CDOA as a regional association. The major events that are rotated and their cycle within the region are:

- Central Districts Champs – annual
- NZ Champs – 5-yearly
- NI School Champs – 3-yearly
- NZ School Champs - 5-yearly

Effectively, a 10-year rotation could look like this:

The club would no longer be eligible to compete in the Frank Smith Trophy, a WOA event that it has actively supported (& won) over the last few years.

Members who compete in the WOA OY series would no longer be eligible for OY points.

FAQ's

Couldn't HB be a member of both WOA & CDOA?

This is not an option, simply because HB could not realistically contribute to both major event rotations. There are other issues such as Council representation and regional organisation.

Wouldn't this change cause a lot of extra travelling for HB members?

HB would still continue with its fortnightly club programme. There are no CD events that members would be expected to travel to – those who travel to CD or WOA Champs will continue to do so.

Can HB be forced to move to CDOA?

No. This suggestion was raised at an NZOF Council meeting where the problems facing CDOA were highlighted. Taking a "big picture" view of the issue, NZOF could see that suggesting a move by HB, a large and active club, is a logical way of ensuring the continued survival of CDOA as a regional association. The final decision rests with HB.

COACHING CORNER

Remember those top five keys for successful orienteering advocated by Neil Kerrison.

1. CARE. Control, Attack point, Route choice, and Exit direction. The attack point is the most crucial.
2. Use the compass as a 'safety net' to reading a map. Always keep your map orientated. Check the compass on leaving every control, from the attack point, as soon as you think you are lost, and on short legs.
3. Look around all the time.
4. Your speed is governed by your interpretation of the map to the ground, so there is a good chance you can run fast in places but go slow between your attack point and the control.
5. Thumb your map.

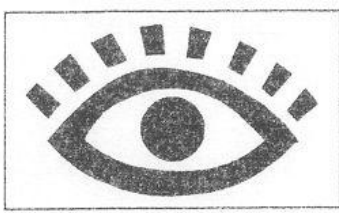
HBOC; 20 Years Ago

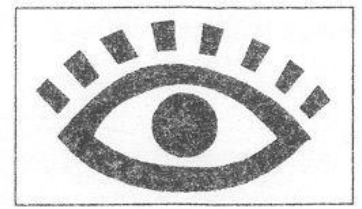
Dave Smith's poem on the same event (abbrev.)

WELLINGTON CHAMPIONSHIPS 2003 – CLASSIC EVENT

The courses were planned to reward competitors' fitness, their assessment of route choice and their navigational skills. They certainly did that. Several of the courses did however prove to be a bit too brutal.

The estimated winning time on course 1 was 105 minutes. The winning time of 110 minutes indicated that the course length was near enough. The other courses were pitched at close to the recommended percentage of course 1 but the percentages proved to be too great, given the terrain. All courses included a mix of free-running farmland, open to semi-open native bush and stream bed navigation. It may well be that the long course had a slightly higher proportion of farmland but the long times on some courses may also indicate that in arduous terrain, the rather more mature competitors have difficulty matching the recommended percentages of course 1. This is something that I should have taken into account.

Smedley is really magic orienteering country. Because of the gorges, many legs required serious thought to route choice options, as well as constant attention to navigation. That is what orienteering is all about though and I hope that you enjoyed, even if only in retrospect, the contest against a really challenging map.

And where else is one likely to be serenaded by a shining cuckoo while waiting for the start?

The landowners were a great bunch to deal with and my thanks go to Terry Walters, manager of Smedley Station and to the owners of the adjoining properties, David Holden of Springvale Station, Garry Boyle of Evertree and Robert Wilson of Tuivale.

I took the West end and Alan took the East end of the map and our courses ended up overlapping by about 200 metres (my orange and Alan's yellow).

My courses started developing on the photogrammetry and then on Geoff's fieldwork. I had a block of young pines, a big clear hill, some flats and some gorge systems to work with. The White and Yellow courses had to be based around the flats as this was the only area with enough tracks and fences without using miles of tape. With the Orange courses I decided to utilise the big hill and not too much gorge. The Reds had the gorges and pines. I was mindful not to have too many controls and I think possibly this led to some of the courses being not quite right - 2 or 3 more controls would have been better. I wanted to create route choice and a bit of adventure - hopefully people found this. I semi-finalised my courses and decided to run some of them. I ran two reds and managed 10 minute k's and the long orange at less than 9 minute k's. With that knowledge I thought they would be a bit long.

Day 1 and I ran Course 3 - I had the advantage of not having to overcome the shock of the native bush, streams and gorges but still found it really challenging. I learnt a lot from Alan's course and thought I'd made my courses too easy for the next day.

Talking to a few people after Day 2, most found it "hard" enough and the k rates were not dissimilar to day 1. I hope everyone enjoyed their "Smedley" experience - I apologise to anyone who found faults. I enjoyed setting and think I learnt a lot to help me in the future.

Thanks to Ken (my controller) who helped me heaps and was great to work with, Pamela for turning out great quality maps and control descriptions and Geoff for giving us the pleasure of experiencing his many hundreds of hours of fieldwork. Terry Walters, the manager of "Smedley", was incredibly helpful to work with and made the whole weekend run smoothly by moving stock and accommodating all our needs.

Feeling a little left out that Alan had all the fun setting the event, I thought it prudent in the interest of friendly relations to go and collect a few controls, besides I needed the exercise.

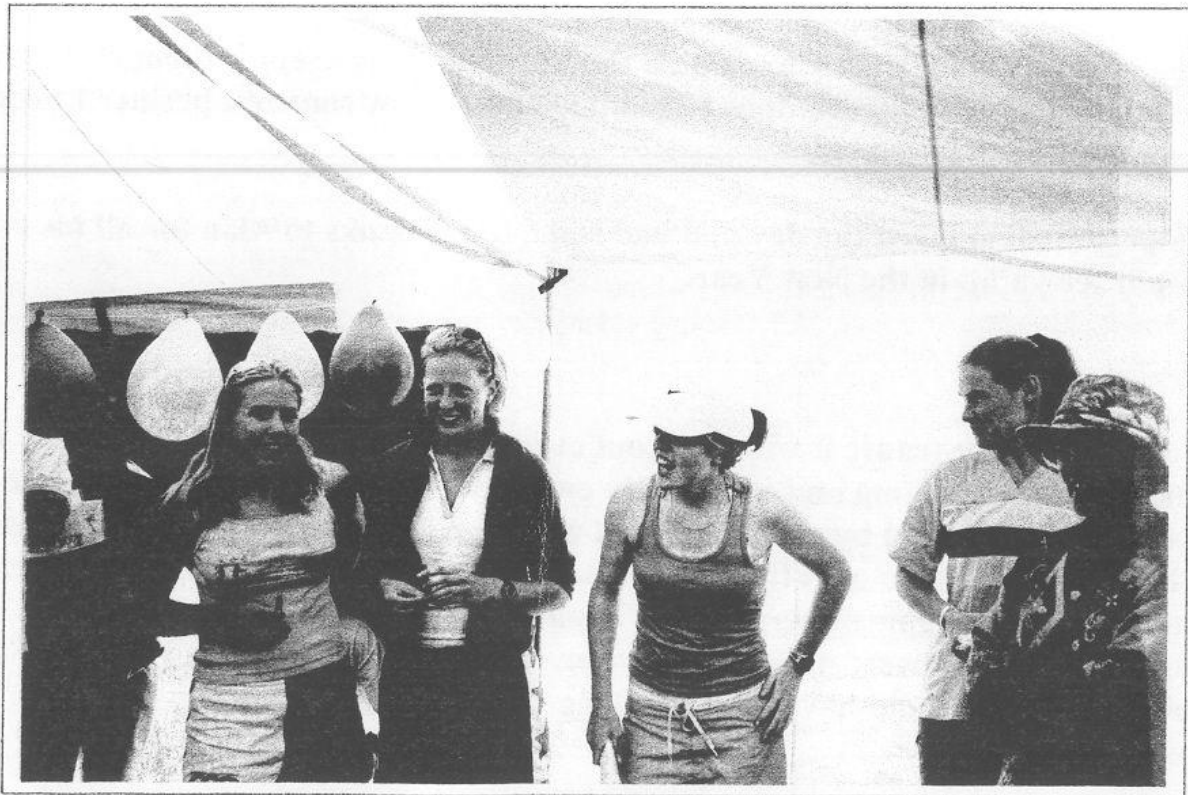
We hope you all enjoyed the day and had some fun, Thanks to Alan for all his efforts and we'll see ya'all in the New Year.
