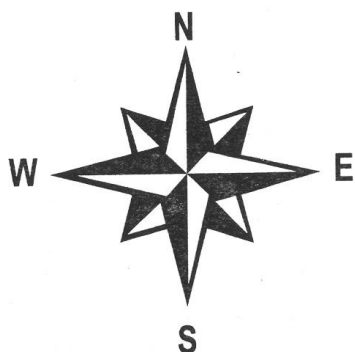

## **NZOF NEWS – MAY 2004**

### **NZOF CONSTITUTION**

The changes to the constitution, made at the AGM in April to take account of the establishment of the Sports Disputes Tribunal of New Zealand, have now been registered with the Registrar of Incorporated Societies. Accordingly the revised constitution is now available on the NZOF website, under N.Z. Orienteering Federation.

### **WACO DISAFFILIATED**

I advise with regret that, as of 1 May, Waikato & Auckland Campus Orienteers (WACO) has been disaffiliated from the NZOF for non-payment of debts.

### **MOUNTAIN BIKE ORIENTEERING (MTBO)**

With the World Championships being held in Australia in October, New Zealand is aiming to be as well represented as possible. The NZ MTBO Championships are being held at Waiuku on 3/4 July and these events will also double as trials for the selection of the team.

Notice of the procedures for selection to the team is being sent separately to all clubs.

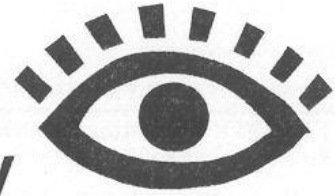

# The Winter Handicap Series – The Thermal Dash

This is the series of events starting on 18<sup>th</sup> July at Guthrie Smith followed by Te Mata Park (1<sup>st</sup> August) then Havelock Hills (15<sup>th</sup> August) and concluding with Pukeora (29<sup>th</sup> August).

It is hoped to have a social gathering and prize giving after the event at Pukeora. This is to be confirmed.

The events will be **Score Events** with 27 controls to be collected in **one hour**.

Controls 1-9,	will be worth	1 point
10-18,		2 points
19-27,		3 points

**Handicaps** will be computed by Geoff Morrison and Rob McDonald, so be nice to them and make cheques out to cash. The handicap will be allocated by **points**, based on previous performance. Eg Hamish scratch, Wayne 5, Pamela 8, Ruth 20

For Example; Event 1. Hamish scores 54 and returns at 56:25. He gains a bonus of 3 for returning early with all controls. **54+3=57**

Returning on time, Wayne scores 52+5=57, Pamela 49+8=57, Ruth 38+20=58

**Ruth wins!!!!**

**Bonus points** will be given if all controls are collected. 1 point per minute early.

**Penalties** will be incurred for every minute or part of, that you are late.  
eg 60:05 = 1 point off, 65:20 = 6 points off

The maps will be **pre marked**

**Start** at one minute intervals

Points are accumulated over the 4 events. The winner has the most points ie there is only one grade but if the handicappers get it right everyone has a fair chance of winning.

The **setters and veters** get the equivalent of the best scores (as in OY's)

## Coaching Corner

### Relocation

Many horror stories have emerged out of the thinnings and steepness of Tangoio. Mistakes of anything up to an hour have been mentioned in despatches. There are many reasons for taking that time, but you can avoid them with a few simple techniques.

Firstly, consider the terrain. The first thing I worked out, while looking around on the way to the start, was that I was going to keep it as simple as possible. Sound tactics was the key, with a minimum opportunity of error. It worked a treat, with a couple of small gliches, where I quickly relocated, the only hiccups.

So why the big mistakes? Was it tiredness, lack of a specific attack point or not admitting to yourself that you were not quite in the right place? A lot of time is wasted scrambling around thinnings in some sort of sadistic attempt to grid search.

So what do you do when the control is not where you expect it will be?

1. Immediately stop and carefully look at your map.
2. Orientate your map and try to match any line features.
3. Look at contour features and vegetation and try and match this up.
4. **Beware** that there might be more than one possible match and take all into consideration.
5. Try to think how far you have come and in which direction since a last known feature.
6. Be prepared to (a) run on further in the direction of the control to find something bigger to relocate on or (b) back track to a big feature to relocate properly if necessary.
7. It is more efficient to get out to something big than to wander around in one place for a long time.

Most importantly, look around. Often you can pick up something unique that can be an absolute god-send, bingo you are on your way again. Your eyes are often easier to use than your legs. You might even spot the control!

Good luck, and good relocation.

But Amber and Scott did just that, being part of an impressive wave of junior orienteers dominating our events.
  - Good luck to all the schools attending the SILVA NZSS champs in Rotorua in July. To date, HB students have won just 5 titles, Ross (2), Amber (2) and David Costigan. Let us hope we can add to that collection. We have had more success in relays with Napier BHS (4), Napier GHS (2), Hastings GHS, Havelock North and Central HB all winning titles. ## **COMPASS POLICY**

The Club has always had a policy to provide compasses for orienteers to borrow at club events. The stock of compasses has slowly disappeared and so we recently purchased \$1000 worth of new compasses (\$65 for thumb and \$38 for baseplate).

To ensure these compasses don't disappear as quickly the compasses are to be held in the caravan and it is the duty of the Assistant of the Day to record the lenders names on the Registration sheet. The compasses are all numbered. It is to also be understood by the lenders that if a compass is lost or broken it is to be their responsibility to replace it.

If you wish to borrow compasses at any other times (e.g. training or away events) you must contact the Equipment Officer (at present Graeme Barrett phone 8775930) to arrange pick up and return.

Having finally tracked down Erica, the first thing she told me was “I have never set normal orienteering courses, only score events”. (Oh dear, and this is an OY !). No worries Erica, they are very similar. You still have to: get permission from the landowners, visit the map and check for changes, decide where to park 100 or more cars, decide where the caravan and registration tables and map corrections and toilet tent and start and map tables and finish should be placed, select control sites, put out controls, make up control descriptions, put out road signs, prepare control collection maps, bring water for drinks controls and tidy it all up afterwards. The different bit is the course setting, which is in the clubs annual preview. Now, Erica, any questions?

Yes, there were lots of questions. The map was first used in 1994 for an APOC event, it now has many new fences (mostly electric) and tracks. It also has some areas where the contours are known (by the old hands) to be a tad unreliable.

On the day we initially had the wrong control descriptions on the table but luckily realised the mistake when putting course lengths on the blackboard. Some got lost getting to the event. Some on the white course didn't find the tape from the start to control 1, and got lost. Many turned up at the start without filling in the tear-off part of the clipcard.

Well done Erica. Welcome to the ranks of “normal” course setters.  
(ps. Erica, I forgot to mention, you also have to write the course setters report.)

# SCHOOL CHAMPS – ROCHFORT

Setting the course, by comparison, was reasonably straightforward.

The area at the northern end of the Rochfort map is reasonably confined and straightforward but proved ideal for the event. It is basically a bowl of moderately detailed farmland surrounded by forest and it was fascinating to see so many competitors bouncing around in all directions and all having fun. Rolf used a figure of eight layout for the longer courses to get the length and it worked well. One minor hiccup came when one property owner, at a late stage, requested that we didn't use his land because of skittish stock, so a rapid readjustment to some courses was required.

The weather looked like it was going to be an issue with rain squalls and strong southerlies predicted. The rain certainly came but fortunately the southerlies did not arrive in any force. The most impressive feature of the day, to me, was the number of competitors who turned up in spite of the weather. Out of 160 entries, 145 actually competed. If anything the rain and mud added to the fun of the day.

## Tangoio West OY4

What a map! During vintage, Paul and I had a look at the eastern end of Tangoio West and decided (believe it or not) that it was too rough to hold an event on. After checking out the western end of the map we decided that with careful setting it was just usable. As the map had not been used for over seven years it required some reworking, particularly in the rock strewn areas up the top. All the parts used have been remapped to a certain extent, but a more concerted effort is necessary to bring the map up to the quality of our other, more recent, maps. I do not want to be an apologist for my courses or the map, but I believe some parts of the setting need explanation. Unfortunately I ran out of time to map the mountain bike tracks which would have made the map much more user friendly - especially for yellow runners. I think the map has a lot of potential as we only used about one third of it. It will take about three more years before the runnability significantly improves, but with sympathetic setting and mapping of the mountain bike tracks it will remain a good map. For anyone setting on it in the future, they need to set courses using kilometre rates of 20 minutes instead of the usual 10 until the thinnings have broken down (I used 14 minutes).

I did find it a difficult map to set good courses on. It is amazing how much you rely on familiarity when setting courses. As it is a map I had never run on, I found I had to make frequent visits to learn what would and wouldn't work on it. As a consequence, the courses were redrawn after each visit. This did ensure of course that Catherine had no hope of gaining an unfair advantage through a sneak preview as she could never be sure which version was to be used. (*I object! I am a picture of honesty when Chris is setting.*) The courses also had to be reworked many times to keep the climb down or avoid parts found during checking that were too gnarly, or full of blackberry. As I went through checking control sites, I would often find quite large features missing from the map - think 5m cliffs! and unmapped rock areas. Generally I thought the contours were pretty good and had no difficulty locating the features we had placed controls on - but then I could do it at my leisure.

I did attempt to keep people out of the thinnings as much as possible. I even tried to think how others would see the course as they went round - I am sure I commented to Paul more than once that Sharon would not thank me for taking her through a certain part so I would avoid it. Clearly I didn't avoid enough! I think the general layout of each course was good

and that they were set at the right level, but they were all just too long (except for white). Everybody I spoke too at the finish said they made many small errors and the odd clanger that proved very costly at the finish. The contours were hard to read being covered in fallen trees and some of the smaller features were disguised by undergrowth. On some courses even the winners commented that they had made errors adding up to 20 minutes or so.

To address the main complaint at the finish on red short, for those who insist the red short #3 control was in the wrong place, have a look at the relationship between the rock #4 was on and the re-entrant #3 was in. They are not on the same contour - there are four contours difference. If you still think it was in the wrong place - tough! I was surprised at the number of experienced orienteers on red courses who chose to go straight on route choice legs when a detour left or right along a track (mapped or not) would have them going in the right general direction, with easy running. Perhaps we have been orienteering too much in the pine forests around Wellington where route choice seldom plays a part.

It is disappointing for a setter to see so many dnfs after an event. After all, the aim is to have everybody complete the course and in reasonable time. Looking at the reason for them after the event, it appears that half were due to people being unable to find a particular control and the rest due to people not finishing their course. It was great to see so many new people and I was impressed at the perseverance of those who competed and kept going to the finish despite being out a long time. I do recommend the mapping committee has a look at mapping the tracks, perhaps in discussion with the mountain bike club, to ensure that only their permanent tracks are mapped. At least the weather smiled on us, though I thought I was going to lose my fingers when I put out the signs in the cold at 8am. A big thank-you to those who helped to collect controls and to Rob, Rosemary and others who helped at the finish checking clipcards and calculating times.

Club member's efforts, especially Hamish, Wayne, Deborah, Ruth, Pamela, Ross, Sarah L, Sharon T, Gary G and Keith were well appreciated, and were the cogs in a smooth running wheel.

Managers, Jennie, Jo, Faye, Derek, Graeme and Steve were responsible for the organisation of most of the 132 participants, with all deservedly tasting some success during the day. Woodford House, Havelock North and Napier Girls' all had a full compliment of teams running in the girls grades which ensured huge battles during the day.

The closest race was in Intermediate Girls where Sophie Eames (HNHS) extracted a huge 8 minute lead at the end of the first leg. NGHS slowly whittled it away, until Kate Morrison caught Chloe Gregory with 3 controls to go and won the race with 5 seconds to spare. Woodford's 3<sup>rd</sup> leg runner, Caroline Parkes produced the fastest time, but her run was to no avail as her previous runner had been disqualified.

With NISS Junior place-getters clashing again, it was always going to be a close clash in the girl's grade. Woodford (3 teams), HNHS (2 teams) and Napier GHS (2 teams) were keen to test each other again in preparation for the NZSS champs. Havelock North led all the way to win by 3 minutes, but not without some close attention from their opposition. Firstly from two of the Woodford teams and then from their other Havelock team. Less than 6 minutes covered the first 4 teams.

Lydia Parker's fastest time could not help her second Havelock team do any better than fourth.

The Senior Girls' relay saw Woodford leading by 4 minutes after the first leg, Havelock by 3 after the second before Amber Morrison tore around the course to win it for NGHS by 10 minutes.

With Katie Eames, Evie Beamish, Jay Barrett and Pearson Williams at their disposal, they have oodles of talent. The Lucknow boy's will be a team for the future, as their accumulative age added up to 21!

HN Intermediate teams were decimated by the school trip to Australia and it enabled Heretaunga to sneak ahead and win the boy's grade. After Bradley Porter set it up, it took Chris McDonald's nerves of steel, to withstand the powerful last leg of Duncan Morrison. The Woodford girls had an easier path, when the expected opposition from Havelock North, Iona and Taradale failed to show.

Thanks to everyone who helped pack up, collect controls and helped in any other way during the day, enabling us to head for home about 3.30pm.
